

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES
OF SANITARY AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 68
OF SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA**

A meeting of the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 68 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 7:15 p.m. on **July 9, 2015**, at 8901 South 154th Street, Omaha, Nebraska. Present were Trustees Rodney Martin, Jef Saveraid, Kevin Ogg and Nick Stanley. Absent: Dale Arndt. Also present Steven J. Olson, Attorney for the District, Doug Kellner, P.E. Thompson, Dreessen & Dorner, Inc., and property owners, Rob Headlee and Gene Mackey.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in The Papillion Times, Papillion, Nebraska, on June 24, 2015, a copy of the Proof of Publication being attached to these Minutes. Notice of this meeting was sent to the Sarpy County Clerk, Sarpy County Courthouse, Highway 370 and 84th Street, Papillion, Nebraska, and to the LaVista City Clerk, LaVista City Hall, 8116 Park View Blvd., LaVista, Nebraska, not less than seven (7) days prior to the date of this meeting. Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members of the Board of Trustees, and a copy of their Acknowledgment of Receipt of Notice is attached to these Minutes. Availability of the Agenda was communicated in the published notice and in the notice to the Trustees of this meeting. All proceedings of the Board were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Chairman presented a proof of publication for the Notice to Contractors for the 2015 Paving Repair to the effect that said Notice to Contractors had been published in *The Papillion Times* on June 17, June 24 and July 1, 2015. Mr. Olson also advised a copy of the meeting notice, which advised a contract may be awarded, was sent to all property owners in the District on June 29. The Chairman then presented the sole bid and bidder for the 2015 Paving Repair, said bid having been received at 4:00 p.m. on July 8, 2015. The Chairman advised that ShawMark, Inc. was the only bidder in the amount of \$191,183.00. The bid was \$5,503.00 higher than the engineer's estimate of the cost for the project. Mr. Kellner advised three sets of the plans and specifications for the project had been obtained, but only one bid was received.

General discussion then occurred whether the contract should be even be awarded at this time or whether it should be rebid next year.

Mr. Kellner advised that ShawMark, Inc. was a qualified contractor and recommended awarding the contract to ShawMark, Inc. After determining that the bid was accompanied by the required bid bond and/or certified check, it was determined that the recommendation of the engineer that the bid of ShawMark, Inc. in the amount of \$191,183.00 be accepted.

After full and careful discussion, the following resolution was then duly moved and seconded, to wit:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary & Improvement District
No. 68 of Sarpy County, Nebraska that the Board does hereby approve and accept

the low bid submitted by ShawMark, Inc. for the 2015 Paving Repair for \$191,183.00; that the Chairman and Clerk be, and hereby are, authorized on behalf of the District to execute said contract with said low bidder for this project provided that the contract to furnish the bonds and certificate of insurance evidencing the coverages required by the specifications for the project.

On roll call on the foregoing motion, the following Trustees voted aye: Rodney Martin, Jef Saveraid, Kevin Ogg, and Nick Stanley. Voting nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution to be duly carried and adopted.

The Chairman then presented the hereinafter described bills, statements, and invoices.

After full and careful discussion, the following resolutions were then duly moved and seconded, to wit:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 68 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the Chairman and Clerk be, and hereby are authorized and directed to execute and deliver warrant nos. 2019R and 2086 thru 2089 dated the date of this meeting to the following payees and in the following amounts, said warrants to be drawn on the General Fund account of the District and to draw interest at the rate of 7% per annum and to be redeemed no later than the date noted below, to wit:

GENERAL FUND ACCOUNT
(Due July 9, 2018)

- (a) Warrant no. 2019R in the sum of \$203.00, payable to Rodney Martin in payment of wood chipper park clean-up/replacement of warrant no. 2019;
- (b) Warrant no. 2086 in the sum of \$1,043.89, payable to Omaha Public Power District in payment of power services account no. 838310061;
- (c) Warrant no. 2087 in the sum of \$450.00, payable to Utilities Service Group in payment of unplugging of sewer line, inv. no.10810;
- (d) Warrant no. 2088 in the sum of \$1,000.00, payable to Upper-Cut Lawns in payment of mowing in June & weed-n-feed;
- (e) Warrant no. 2089 in the sum of \$217.32, payable to Rodney Martin in payment of reimbursement for wood chipper, 2015 park clean-up;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 68 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the Chairman and Clerk be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to execute and deliver warrant no. 2043, dated the date of this meeting, to the following payee and in the

following amount to be drawn on the Construction Fund of the District and to draw interest at the rate of 7% per annum, interest to be payable on July 1 of each year, and to be redeemed on later that the dated noted below, subject to extension of said maturity date by order of the District Court, Sarpy County, Nebraska, after notice is given as required by law, to wit:

CONSTRUCTION FUND ACCOUNT

(Due July 9, 2020)

(a) Warrant No. 2043 in the sum of \$4,867.17, payable to Steven J. Olson, in payment of legal services, 2015 Paving Improvements, invoice nos. 45831 and 45905;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 68 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that both they and the District hereby find and determine and covenant, warrant and agree as follows: the improvements and/or facilities being financed or refinanced by the above Warrants are for essential governmental functions and are designed to serve members of the general public on an equal basis; all said improvements have from the time of their first acquisition and construction been owned, are owned and are to be owned by the District or another political subdivision; to the extent special assessments have been or are to be levied for any of said improvements, such special assessments have been or are to be levied upon Nebraska law as a matter of general application to all property specially benefited by said improvements in the District; the development of the land in the District is for residential or commercial use and the development of the land in the District for sale and occupation by the general public has proceeded and is proceeding with reasonable speed; other than any incidental use of said improvements by a developer during the initial period of development of said improvements, there have been, are and will be no persons with rights to use such improvements other than as members of the general public; none of the proceeds of said Bonds or any refinanced indebtedness have been or will be loaned to any private person or entity; the District hereby authorizes and directs the Chairperson or Clerk to file or cause to be filed, when due, an information reporting form pursuant to Section 149(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, pertaining to the above Warrants; and the District does not reasonably expect to sell or otherwise dispose of said improvements and/or facilities, in whole or in part, prior to the last maturity of the above Warrants.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 68 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the District hereby covenants, warrants and agrees as follows: (a) to take all actions necessary under current law to maintain the tax exempt status (as to taxpayers generally) of interest on the above Warrants; and (b) to the extent that it may lawfully do so, the District hereby designates the above Warrants as its "qualified tax exempt obligation"

under Section 265(b)(3)(B)(ii) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and covenants and warrants that the District does not reasonably expect to issue warrants or bonds or other obligations aggregating in the principal amount of more than \$5,000,000 during the calendar year in which the above Warrants are to be issued.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 68 of Sarpy County, Nebraska that this and the preceding Resolutions are hereby adopted as the Certificate with Respect to Arbitrage of the District pertaining to the above Warrants and the District and the Chairman and Clerk of the District hereby further certify, as of the date of the registration of the above Warrants with the County Treasurer of Sarpy County, Nebraska, as follows:

1. No separate reserve or replacement fund has been or will be established with respect to the above Warrants. The District reasonably anticipates that monies in its Bond Fund reasonably attributable to the above Warrants in excess of the less of: (a) 10% of the net principal proceeds of the above Warrants, (b) the maximum annual debt service due on the above Warrants, or (c) 125% of average annual debt service due on the above Warrants will be expended for payment of principal of and interest on the above Warrants within 13 months after receipt of such monies. That amount which is currently held in the District's Bond Fund which exceeds the amount which is to be expended for payment of principal and interest on the above Warrants within 13 months after receipt of such monies, plus that amount arrived at pursuant to the immediately preceding sentence, will not be invested in any securities or any other investment obligations which bear a yield, as computed in accordance with the actuarial method, in excess of the yield on the above Warrants.

2. To the best of their knowledge, information and belief, the above expectations are reasonable.

3. The District has not been notified of any listing of it by the Internal Revenue Service as an issuer that may not certify its bonds.

4. This Certificate is being passed, executed and delivered pursuant to Section 1.148(b)(2) of the Income Tax Regulations of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

On roll call on the foregoing motion, the following Trustees voted aye: Rodney Martin, Jef Saveraid, Kevin Ogg and Nick Stanley. Voting nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution to be duly carried and adopted.

The Chairman advised that 21 volunteer property owners recently removed dead trees, picked up debris and trimmed trees at the District's park.

Thereupon the meeting adjourned.
