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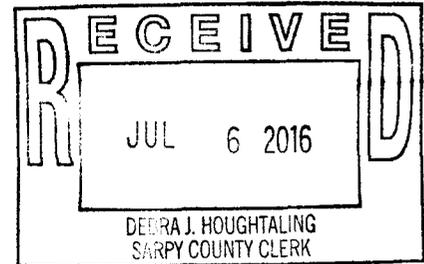

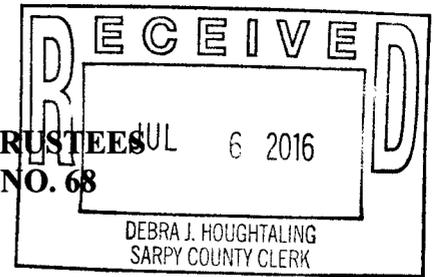

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES
OF SANITARY AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 68
OF SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA**



A meeting of the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 68 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 7:15 p.m. on **June 9, 2016**, at 8901 South 154th Street, Omaha, Nebraska. Present were Trustees Jef Saveraid, Kevin Ogg and Nick Stanley. Absent: Rodney Martin and Dale Arndt. Also present Steven J. Olson, Attorney for the District, and resident property owners, Kathy Seymour and Rob Headlee.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in The Papillion Times, Papillion, Nebraska, on May 25, 2016, a copy of the Proof of Publication being attached to these Minutes. Notice of this meeting was sent to the Sarpy County Clerk, Sarpy County Courthouse, Highway 370 and 84th Street, Papillion, Nebraska, and to the LaVista City Clerk, LaVista City Hall, 8116 Park View Blvd., LaVista, Nebraska, not less than seven (7) days prior to the date of this meeting. Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members of the Board of Trustees, and a copy of their Acknowledgment of Receipt of Notice is attached to these Minutes. Availability of the Agenda was communicated in the published notice and in the notice to the Trustees of this meeting. All proceedings of the Board were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The undersigned Clerk hereby certifies that these Minutes were written and available for public inspection within ten (10) working days after the date of said meeting.

The Clerk noted that the Chairman was unable to be present for the meeting. After full and careful discussion, the following resolution was then duly moved and seconded, to wit:

BE IT RESOLVED Trustee Nick Stanley is hereby appointed as Acting Chairman for the purposes of this meeting only.

On roll call on the foregoing motion, the following Trustees voted aye: Jef Saveraid, Nick Stanley and Kevin Ogg. Voting nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution to be duly carried and adopted.

The Chairman advised general fund warrant no. 2111 payable to Upper-Cut Lawns in the amount of \$300.00 for park mowing was issued on May 13, 2016 in order to pay a then current expense. The Chairman also presented the hereinafter described bills, statements and invoices.

After full and careful discussion, the following resolutions were then duly moved and seconded, to wit:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 68 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the action of the Chairman and Clerk in executing and delivering warrant no. 2111, dated May 13, 2016 to the following payee and in the following amount said warrant to be drawn on the

General Fund account of the District and to draw interest at the rate of 7% per annum and to be redeemed no later than the date noted below is hereby ratified and confirmed, to wit:

GENERAL FUND ACCOUNT

(Due May 13, 2019)

(a) Warrant No. 2111 in the sum of \$300.00, payable to Upper-Cut Lawns, in payment of park mowing April;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 68 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the Chairman and Clerk be, and hereby are authorized and directed to execute and deliver warrant nos. 2112 through 2119 dated the date of this meeting to the following payees and in the following amounts, said warrants to be drawn on the General Fund account of the District and to draw interest at the rate of 7% per annum and to be redeemed no later than the date noted below, to wit:

GENERAL FUND ACCOUNT

(Due June 9, 2019)

(a) Warrant No. 2112 in the sum of \$750.00, payable to Upper-Cut Lawns, in payment of park mowing May;

(b) Warrant No. 2113 in the sum of \$295.00, payable to Thompson, Dreessen & Dorner, Inc., in payment of inv. no. 114875;

(c) Warrant No. 2114 in the sum of \$784.79, payable to Steven J. Olson, in payment of legal services rendered invoice nos. 46644 and 46673;

(d) Warrant No. 2115 in the sum of \$2,157.74, payable to Omaha Public Power District, in payment of power services, account no. 8383100061;

(e) Warrant No. 2116 in the sum of \$346.00, payable to NP Dodge Insurance Agency, in payment of invoice no. 30955;

(f) Warrant No. 2117 in the sum of \$1,000.00, payable to Bankers Trust Company, in payment of invoice nos. 26279 and 26265;

(g) Warrant No. 2118 in the sum of \$23.46, payable to One Call Concepts Inc., in payment of invoice nos. 5120639, 6010642, 6020645, 6030644, 6040643 and 6050651;

(h) Warrant No. 2119 in the sum of \$600.00, payable to Upper-Cut Lawns, in payment of park mowing June;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 68 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that both they and the District hereby find and determine and covenant, warrant and agree as follows: the improvements and/or facilities being financed or refinanced by the above Warrants are for essential governmental functions and are designed to serve members of the general public on an equal basis; all said improvements have from the time of their first acquisition and construction been owned, are owned and are to be owned by the District or another political subdivision; to the extent special assessments have been or are to be levied for any of said improvements, such special assessments have been or are to be levied upon Nebraska law as a matter of general application to all property specially benefited by said improvements in the District; the development of the land in the District is for residential or commercial use and the development of the land in the District for sale and occupation by the general public has proceeded and is proceeding with reasonable speed; other than any incidental use of said improvements by a developer during the initial period of development of said improvements, there have been, are and will be no persons with rights to use such improvements other than as members of the general public; none of the proceeds of said Bonds or any refinanced indebtedness have been or will be loaned to any private person or entity; the District hereby authorizes and directs the Chairperson or Clerk to file or cause to be filed, when due, an information reporting form pursuant to Section 149(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, pertaining to the above Warrants; and the District does not reasonably expect to sell or otherwise dispose of said improvements and/or facilities, in whole or in part, prior to the last maturity of the above Warrants.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 68 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the District hereby covenants, warrants and agrees as follows: (a) to take all actions necessary under current law to maintain the tax exempt status (as to taxpayers generally) of interest on the above Warrants; and (b) to the extent that it may lawfully do so, the District hereby designates the above Warrants as its "qualified tax exempt obligation" under Section 265(b)(3)(B)(ii) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and covenants and warrants that the District does not reasonably expect to issue warrants or bonds or other obligations aggregating in the principal amount of more than \$5,000,000 during the calendar year in which the above Warrants are to be issued.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 68 of Sarpy County, Nebraska that this and the preceding Resolutions are hereby adopted as the Certificate with Respect to Arbitrage of the District pertaining to the above Warrants and the District and the

Chairman and Clerk of the District hereby further certify, as of the date of the registration of the above Warrants with the County Treasurer of Sarpy County, Nebraska, as follows:

1. No separate reserve or replacement fund has been or will be established with respect to the above Warrants. The District reasonably anticipates that monies in its Bond Fund reasonably attributable to the above Warrants in excess of the less of: (a) 10% of the net principal proceeds of the above Warrants, (b) the maximum annual debt service due on the above Warrants, or (c) 125% of average annual debt service due on the above Warrants will be expended for payment of principal of and interest on the above Warrants within 13 months after receipt of such monies. That amount which is currently held in the District's Bond Fund which exceeds the amount which is to be expended for payment of principal and interest on the above Warrants within 13 months after receipt of such monies, plus that amount arrived at pursuant to the immediately preceding sentence, will not be invested in any securities or any other investment obligations which bear a yield, as computed in accordance with the actuarial method, in excess of the yield on the above Warrants.

2. To the best of their knowledge, information and belief, the above expectations are reasonable.

3. The District has not been notified of any listing of it by the Internal Revenue Service as an issuer that may not certify its bonds.

4. This Certificate is being passed, executed and delivered pursuant to Section 1.148(b)(2) of the Income Tax Regulations of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

On roll call on the foregoing motion, the following Trustees voted aye: Jef Saveraid, Nick Stanley and Kevin Ogg. Voting nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution to be duly carried and adopted.

The Acting Chairman advised the asphalt contractor will overlay the asphalt trail in the District's park in July or August as the park soil needs to dry, otherwise the contractor's trucks may damage the grass.

The Acting Chairman advised the annual premium for property insurance was \$1,400.00 for insuring the District's playground equipment at \$100,000.00 and the wood fence at \$10,000.00 with a \$10,000.00 deductible. After full and careful discussion, the following resolution was then duly moved and seconded, to wit:

BE IT RESOLVED NP Dodge Insurance is hereby authorized to add property coverage for the District's playground equipment for \$100,000.00 and wood fence at \$10,000.00 with a \$10,000.00 deductible for an annual premium of \$1,400.00.

On roll call on the foregoing motion, the following Trustees voted aye: Jef Saveraid, Nick Stanley and Kevin Ogg. Voting nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution to be duly carried and adopted.

The Clerk advised that an election will be held on September 13, 2016 for the purpose of electing trustees for the District, which election will be held by mail in ballot and any property owner desiring to be on the ballot must file an application with the election commissioner on or before July 25, 2016.

Kathy Seymour advised she had recently filed a complaint with Sarpy County Planning regarding the overgrown weeds along Highway 50 and Chandler Road and on Lot 3, Echo Hills across the street from the District's park and Sarpy County transferred the complaint to the City of LaVista as Lot 3 was subject to LaVista's jurisdiction. Ms. Seymour advised the weeds within the right-of-way of Highway 50 and Chandler Road had recently been mowed but the weeds on the west side of Lot 3 across from the District's park were still present.

Thereupon the meeting adjourned.
