


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**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES
OF SANITARY AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 92
OF SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA**



A meeting of the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 92 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, was convened at 6:30 p.m. on **March 24, 2011**, at 8901 South 154th Street, Omaha, Nebraska. Present were Trustees Tim Albers, Stephanie Adams, Ann Rasmussen, Linda J. Paesl and Aaron Thornton. Absent: None. Also present Steven J. Olson, Attorney for the District and Robert McKee, Olmsted & Perry Consulting Engineers, Engineers for the District.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in The Papillion Times, Papillion, Nebraska, on March 9, 2011, a copy of the Proof of Publication being attached to these Minutes. Notice of this meeting was sent to the Sarpy County Clerk, Sarpy County Courthouse, Highway 370 and 84th Street, Papillion, Nebraska, not less than seven (7) days prior to the date of this meeting. Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members of the Board of Trustees, and a copy of their Acknowledgment of Receipt of Notice is attached to these Minutes. Availability of the Agenda was communicated in the published notice and in the notice to the Trustees of this meeting. All proceedings of the Board were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Mr. McKee advised the Board that the Sarpy County Board of Commissioners adopted Resolution 2011-057 on March 1, 2011 approving the plans and specifications for the District's 2010 Street Reconstruction Project. Mr. McKee further advised that the Pre-Construction Conference was held on March 1 with the contractor, Swain Construction, at the project site and a "Notice To Proceed" was issued at the meeting to Swain Construction.

Mr. McKee advised that Swain Construction will begin work in approximately 45 days and the work should be completed within approximately 14 days thereafter. The Board also reviewed reconstruction locations and the scope of work to be performed for the project.

The Chairman advised that Waste Management had issued a credit to the District in the sum of \$90.98 which was less than the requested amount of \$100.50. Trustee Paesl will investigate whether other garbage contractors are available to replace Waste Management.

The Chairman advised that general fund warrant nos. 2162, 2163, and 2164 each in the sum of \$970.20 payable to Omaha Public Power District were issued in order to pay then current expenses. The Chairman also presented the hereinafter described bills, statements and invoices.

After full and careful discussion, the following resolutions were then duly moved and seconded, to wit:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 92 of Sarpy County, Nebraska the action of the Chairman and Clerk in executing and delivering warrant nos. 2162, 2163 and 2164 dated January 12, 2011 to the following payee and in the following amounts, said warrants drawn

on the general fund of the District and to draw interest at the rate of 7% per annum and to be redeemed no later than the date noted below is hereby ratified and confirmed, to wit:

GENERAL FUND ACCOUNT
(Due January 12, 2014)

- (a) Warrant No. 2162 in the sum of \$970.20, payable to Omaha Public Power District, in payment of 11-29-2010 to 12-29-2010;
- (b) Warrant No. 2163 in the sum of \$970.20, payable to Omaha Public Power District, in payment of 12-29-2010 to 1-27-2011;
- (c) Warrant No. 2164 in the sum of \$970.20, payable to Omaha Public Power District, in payment of 1-27-2011 to 2-25-2011;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 92 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the Chairman and Clerk be, and hereby are authorized and directed to execute and deliver warrant nos. 2165 through 2167 dated the date of this meeting to following payees and in the following amounts, said warrants drawn on the general fund account of the District and to draw interest at the rate of 7% per annum and to be redeemed no later than the date noted below, to wit:

GENERAL FUND ACCOUNT
(Due March 24, 2014)

- (a) Warrant No. 2165 in the sum of \$260.00, payable to Martin Hocevar, in payment of preparation of 2010 tax forms, 1099s and W-2s.;
- (b) Warrant No. 2166 in the sum of \$1,994.49, payable to Steven J. Olson, in payment of legal services rendered;
- (c) Warrant No. 2167 in the sum of \$985.00, payable to Omaha Public Power District, in payment of 2-25-2011 to 3-27-2011;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 92 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the Chairman and Clerk be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to execute and deliver Warrant No. 1674, dated the date of this meeting, to the following payees and in the following amounts to be drawn on the Construction Fund of the District and to draw interest at the rate of 7% per annum, interest to be payable on July 1 of each year, and to be redeemed no later that the dated noted below, subject to extension of said maturity date by order of the District Court, Sarpy County, Nebraska, after notice is given as required by law, to wit;

CONSTRUCTION FUND

(Due March 24, 2016)

(a) Warrant No. 1674, in the sum of \$4,190.57, payable to Olmsted & Perry Consulting Engineers Inc., in payment of engineering services for 2010 Street Reconstruction project;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 92 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that both they and the District hereby find and determine and covenant, warrant and agree as follows: the improvements and/or facilities being financed or refinanced by the above Warrants are for essential governmental functions and are designed to serve members of the general public on an equal basis; all said improvements have from the time of their first acquisition and construction been owned, are owned and are to be owned by the District or another political subdivision; to the extent special assessments have been or are to be levied for any of said improvements, such special assessments have been or are to be levied upon Nebraska law as a matter of general application to all property specially benefited by said improvements in the District; the development of the land in the District is for residential or commercial use and the development of the land in the District for sale and occupation by the general public has proceeded and is proceeding with reasonable speed; other than any incidental use of said improvements by a developer during the initial period of development of said improvements, there have been, are and will be no persons with rights to use such improvements other than as members of the general public; none of the proceeds of said Bonds or any refinanced indebtedness have been or will be loaned to any private person or entity; the District hereby authorizes and directs the Chairperson or Clerk to file or cause to be filed, when due, an information reporting form pursuant to Section 149(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, pertaining to the above Warrants; and the District does not reasonably expect to sell or otherwise dispose of said improvements and/or facilities, in whole or in part, prior to the last maturity of the above Warrants.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 92 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the District hereby covenants, warrants and agrees as follows: (a) to take all actions necessary under current law to maintain the tax exempt status (as to taxpayers generally) of interest on the above Warrants; and (b) to the extent that it may lawfully do so, the District hereby designates the above Warrants as its "qualified tax exempt obligation" under Section 265(b)(3)(B)(ii) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and covenants and warrants that the District does not reasonably expect to issue warrants or bonds or other obligations aggregating in the principal amount of more than \$5,000,000 during the calendar year in which the above Warrants are to be issued.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 92 of Sarpy County, Nebraska that this and the preceding Resolutions are hereby adopted as the Certificate with Respect to Arbitrage of the District pertaining to the above Warrants and the District and the Chairman and Clerk of the District hereby further certify, as of the date of the registration of the above Warrants with the County Treasurer of Sarpy County, Nebraska, as follows:

1. No separate reserve or replacement fund has been or will be established with respect to the above Warrants. The District reasonably anticipates that monies in its Bond Fund reasonably attributable to the above Warrants in excess of the less of: (a) 10% of the net principal proceeds of the above Warrants, (b) the maximum annual debt service due on the above Warrants, or (c) 125% of average annual debt service due on the above Warrants will be expended for payment of principal of and interest on the above Warrants within 13 months after receipt of such monies. That amount which is currently held in the District's Bond Fund which exceeds the amount which is to be expended for payment of principal and interest on the above Warrants within 13 months after receipt of such monies, plus that amount arrived at pursuant to the immediately preceding sentence, will not be invested in any securities or any other investment obligations which bear a yield, as computed in accordance with the actuarial method, in excess of the yield on the above Warrants.

2. To the best of their knowledge, information and belief, the above expectations are reasonable.

3. The District has not been notified of any listing of it by the Internal Revenue Service as an issuer that may not certify its bonds.

4. This Certificate is being passed, executed and delivered pursuant to Section 1.148(b)(2) of the Income Tax Regulations of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

On roll call on the foregoing motion, the following Trustees voted aye: Tim Albers, Stephanie Adams, Ann Rasmussen, Linda J. Paesl and Aaron Thornton. Voting nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution to be duly carried and adopted.

A general discussion then ensued regarding adding recreational facilities in the District's park. After full and careful discussion, the following resolution was then duly moved and seconded, to wit:

BE IT RESOLVED the engineer of the District is hereby requested to prepare a cost estimate to build a children's "sprinkler park" in replacement of the volleyball court in the District's park.

On roll call on the foregoing motion, the following Trustees voted aye: Tim Albers, Stephanie Adams, Ann Rasmussen, Linda J. Paesl and Aaron Thornton. Voting nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution to be duly carried and adopted.

A general discussion then ensued regarding the sealing of cracks in the District's streets. The engineer advised that Swain Construction could perform such work after the 2010 Street Reconstruction Project was completed. After full and careful discussion, the following resolution was then duly moved and seconded, to wit:

BE IT RESOLVED that the engineer is hereby authorized to engage Swain Construction to seal and repair not more than 1200 feet of cracks in District streets.

On roll call on the foregoing motion, the following Trustees voted aye: Tim Albers, Stephanie Adams, Ann Rasmussen, Linda J. Paesl and Aaron Thornton. Voting nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution to be duly carried and adopted.

Thereupon the meeting adjourned.
