

Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees
April 23, 2014

A meeting of the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 101 of Sarpy County, Nebraska was convened in open public session at 7:00 p.m. on the 23rd day of April, 2014, at the La Platte Community Church, 16412 Main Street, La Platte, Nebraska.

Present at the meeting were: Doug Hill, Don Story, Chip Frazier and Lou Riedmann, Trustees of the District; Jeff Farnham, the District's attorney; Jim Olmsted of Olmsted & Perry Consulting Engineers; and Rene Nelson and Joy Nelson of Urban Utilities.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in *The Bellevue Leader* on April 16, 2014, a copy of the Proof of Publication being attached to these Minutes. Advance notice was also given to the Board of Trustees and a copy of their acknowledgment of the receipt of such notice is attached to these minutes. Notice was also given to the County Clerk of Sarpy County, Nebraska per the attached certificate of the Clerk of the District. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notices and in the notices to the Board of Trustees and the County Clerk.

The Clerk then certified that notices of this meeting had been given to the County Clerk of Sarpy County, Nebraska, at least seven days prior to the time set by the Board of Trustees for this meeting, said Certificate being attached to these minutes and made a part hereof by this reference.

All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Chairman then stated that one copy of the reproducible written material to be discussed at this meeting was available for examination or copying and that a current copy of the Open Meetings Act was posted in the meeting room.

Trustee Don Story made a motion to approve the minutes of the last meeting and Trustee Chip Frazier seconded the motion. Upon motion made and duly seconded and vote taken in open session convened, the motion carried.

The District's Clerk then presented the Treasurer's Report as of March 31, 2014. The balance in the District's General Fund was approximately \$155,061.82; the balance in the District's General Fund Investment account was approximately \$0.00; the cash balance in the District's Bond Fund account was approximately \$138,102.95; the balance in the District's Bond Fund Investment account was approximately \$519,848.33; and the Service Fee Fund balance was approximately \$47,490.40.

The Chairman stated that the next item of business was payment of existing bills.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 101 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that both they and the District hereby find and determine and covenant, warrant and agree as follows: the improvements and/or facilities being financed or refinanced by the above Warrants are for essential governmental functions and are designed to serve members of the general public on an equal basis; all said improvements have from the time of their first acquisition and construction been owned, are owned and are to be owned by the District or another political subdivision; to the extent special assessments have been or are to be levied for any of said improvements, such special assessments have been or are to be levied under Nebraska law as a matter of general application to all property specially benefitted by said improvements in the District; the development of the land in the District is for residential or commercial use and the development of the land in the District for sale and occupation by the general public has proceeded and is proceeding with reasonable speed; other than any incidental use of said improvements by a developer during the initial period of development of said improvements, there have been, are and will be no persons with rights to use such improvements other than as members of the general public; none of the proceeds of said Bonds or any refinanced

indebtedness have been or will be loaned to any private person or entity; the District hereby authorizes and directs the Chairperson or Clerk to file or cause to be filed, when due, an information reporting form pursuant to Section 149(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, pertaining to the above Warrants; and the District does not reasonably expect to sell or otherwise dispose of said improvements and/or facilities, in whole or in part, prior to the last maturity of the above Warrants.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 101 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the District hereby covenants, warrants and agrees as follows: (a) to take all actions necessary under current federal law to maintain the tax exempt status (as to taxpayers generally) of interest on the above warrants and (b) to the extent that it may lawfully do so, the District hereby designates the above Warrants as its "qualified tax exempt obligations" under Section 265(b)(3)(B)(ii) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as amended and covenant and warrants that the District does not reasonably expect to issue warrants or bonds or other obligations aggregating in the principal amount of more than \$5,000,000.00 during a calendar year in which the Warrants are issued.

1. No separate reserves or replacement fund has been or will be established with respect to the above Warrants. The District reasonably anticipates that the monies in its bond fund reasonably attributable to the above Warrants in excess of the lesser of: (a) 10% of the net principle proceeds of the above Warrants, or (b) the maximum annual debar service due on the above Warrants, or (c) 125% of the average annual debt service due on the above Warrants will be expended for payment and principle of and interest on the above amount arrived at pursuant to invested in any securities or any other of computed in accordance with the actuarial method, in excess of the yield on the above Warrants.
2. To the best of their knowledge, information and belief, the above expectations are reasonable.
3. The District has not been notified of any listing of it by the Internal Revenue Services as an issuer that may not certify its bonds.
4. This Certificate is being passed, executed and delivered pursuant to Section 1.102-13, 1.103-14 and 103-15 of the Income Tax Regulations under the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, and under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

Mr. Nelson then asked if there were any questions about the sewer reports. Chip Frazier wondered if the incident at 1916 Hanson Drive, which was listed on the February report, was an instance where the homeowner paid the plumber to clear the line. Mr. Nelson indicated that that was the case.

Mr. Nelson then presented his yearly request for the purchase of extra pumps and spare parts in the amount of \$15,265.89. After discussion Trustee Chip Frazier made a motion to approve the

request and authorized Mr. Nelson to purchase the pumps and parts. Trustee Don Story seconded the motion and all Trustees present voted in favor thereof.

There was then discussion about the sewer use fee to be charged to residents of the District for 2014/2015. It was determined that the sewer use fee would remain at \$300, including sales tax. Trustee Chip Frazier made a motion to approve the \$300 fee and authorize Joy Nelson of Urban Utilities to proceed with the billing for the sewer use fee in early July. Trustee Don Story seconded the motion. All Trustees present voted in favor thereof.

Mr. Nelson then indicated that because of the rough winter the wetlands is not in as good a shape as it usually is at this time of the year. He reported that the ammonia levels were high and that there is a large cap present. There was discussion about adding bacteria when the soil temperatures go up in an effort to remove the cap. Mr. Nelson advised that he would be monitoring the situation as the weather improves.

Mr. Nelson then presented a letter from the Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality dated April 11, 2014 concerning a possible change in the District's permit to require a certain level of ammonia. The permit at the present time is just a reporting permit.

The Chairman then advised the Board that it made sense to consider the 2013 Treatment Plant Improvements at this time and consequently that item was moved forward on the Agenda. The District's engineer, Jim Olmsted, reported to the Board that his firm is working on the plans, to include a new measuring device and splitting structure. Mr. Olmsted stated that the District would be ready to go to bids at the end of May or first part of June. After further discussion it was determined that there would be a bid opening for this project on June 3rd and the Board of Trustees would meet on June 4th to consider the bids and award the contract.

The Chairman then indicated that the Agenda item concerning 2013 Drainage and Guardrail Improvements would also be moved forward. Mr. Olmsted then advised the Board that they were working on these plans and that this work would also be bid on June 3rd, with the bids to be considered and awarded at the June 4th Board of Trustees Meeting. Trustees Lou Riedmann and Doug Hill advised the Board that they had met with the Betty Lake Board and that they were very receptive to this project. There was a request for movement of the westerly inlet to a location farther east. There was discussion that the curb and gutter to be installed would guide the water to at least two drop inlets. There was also discussion about the distance between the guard rail and the slope to the lake. Mr. Olmsted advised the Board that they would try and leave the guard rail in place. There was also a discussion concerning removal of a standing tree and also removal of trees that have fallen into the lake. Trustee Doug Hill indicated that an easement would be necessary in order for the District to do this work and to maintain it in the future and he advised the District's attorney that he would obtain a legal description and get it to him so that the easement could be prepared.

Mr. Olmsted advised that there was approximately a three-month window for construction of both the 2013 Drainage and Guardrail Improvements and the 2013 Treatment Plan Improvements project. There was then discussion about keeping the road open at various times, including the 4th of July weekend. Mr. Olmsted said that they would handle this with the residents and would go door to door and advise people of the construction. The Chris Lake Association will also send out an e-mail about this project when the time comes.

Mr. Olmsted then addressed the fact that joint sealing still needs to be done on roads within the District. He advised the Board that he would look into this and also would look into fill patching around some of the manhole covers in the District.

Mr. Farnham then advised the Board that he had received a title search showing the outlots owned by the District within the boundaries of the Sanitary and Improvement District. A copy of the tile search dated April 21, 2014 was presented to the Board of Trustees along with a map prepared by Olmsted & Perry showing the locations of the outlots within the District. There was discussion concerning the fact that the map did not show the complete southern and western boundaries of the District, nor did it show the dike which the Trustees believe is owned by the District. Mr. Farnham indicated that he would check on this and any necessary information, including deeds to the dike, would be sent to Doug Hill, Jim Olmsted and the title company so that the map could be updated.

The Board acknowledged that it had received several requests from residents of the District to purchase a portion of certain of the District's outlots. After discussion it was determined that the District wanted to complete the preparation of the map and that they would consider this matter at a future meeting.

The District's attorney then advised the Board that he had obtained a title search for Lake 1 which showed that the title to Lake 1 is in the name of Hanson's Lake No. 1 Association. Doug Hill indicated that Scott Reichstad provided the Board with a copy of a deed showing that Lake 1 had been deeded to the SID. The District's attorney was directed to investigate this further to determine the ownership of Lot 1.


There was then a short discussion about putting up "No Trespassing" signs on the dike and the District's drainage ditch on the eastern end of the District. Trustee Chip Frazier stated that it might make sense to also post signs at the west end of the dike.

Trustee Lou Riedmann then stated that at the Betty Lake meeting there was a request for "No Outlet" signs on Paradise, Mickey and Gate Streets. Rene Nelson indicated that he would take care of installing these signs.


There were no future agenda items.

To Whom It May Concern:

NDEQ is required every three years by the Federal Clean Water Act (CWA) to update the state's surface water quality standards. These standards are found in our Title 117 "Nebraska Surface Water Standards" (<http://deq.ne.gov/RuleAndR.nsf/pages/117-TOC>) and drive the NPDES permit limits that you follow for your waste water treatment facilities. We anticipate proposing updates to Title 117 to the Environmental Quality Council in October 2014.

Possible changes in Title 117:

1) Ammonia Criteria Reductions:

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) adopted the document "Aquatic Life Ambient Water Quality Criteria for Ammonia - Freshwater 2013" as a CWA §304(a) criteria recommendation.

You may have ammonia limits in your current NPDES permit; thus, new ammonia criteria could affect your future permit limits.

The 2013 Ammonia Criteria are more stringent than EPA's previous criteria recommendation and are more stringent than what is currently adopted in Title 117. The new criteria recommendation is based on additional information regarding the toxicity of ammonia to freshwater unionid mussels. Unionid mussels are much more sensitive to ammonia than the fish and invertebrates that were previously used to calculate the criteria. Freshwater unionid mussels are found statewide in Nebraska.

For example, the 2013 Ammonia Criteria at pH 8.0 and temperature of 20° C are about 45% to 39% of the current acute criteria (depends on current Aquatic Life Use Class) and about 45% of the current chronic criteria. These reductions are more pronounced for acute criteria as pH and temperature increase (about 17% of current acute criteria for Warmwater Class B streams at pH 9.0 and 30° C).

- 2) **New Aquatic Life Criteria for Carbaryl:**
Carbaryl is a pesticide, commonly known as Sevin®. It is registered in the U.S. for controlling insect pests on more than 115 agricultural and other sites, including home and garden uses. EPA's §304(a) criteria recommendation is 2.1 µg/l to protect aquatic life from both acute and chronic toxicity.
- 3) **Addition of Several New Lakes:**
New lakes need to be added to the state regulations, to ensure proper protection.
- 4) **Housekeeping changes for the regulation, including name changes, location corrections, etc.**
- 5) **Other needed changes suggested by the public:**
If you know of other changes that you feel are important, please let us know. We are happy to discuss and consider new ideas.






