



MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF SANITARY AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 133 OF SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA HELD AT 11:30 A.M. ON APRIL 8, 2015 AT 11440 WEST CENTER ROAD, OMAHA, NEBRASKA

The meeting of the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 133 of Sarpy County, Nebraska was convened in open and public session at 11:30 A.M. on April 8, 2015 at 11440 West Center Road, Omaha, Nebraska.

Present at the meeting were Trustees Dennis Janes, Larry Duckworth, and Jeffrey Teig. Also present was John H. Fullenkamp, attorney for the District and Doug Dreessen, engineer for the District.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in The Bellevue Leader on March 25, 2015 and a copy of the Proof of Publication being attached to these minutes. Notice of the meeting was simultaneously given to all members of the Board of Trustees and a copy of their Acknowledgment of Receipt of Notice is attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the published notice and in the notice to the Trustees of this meeting. All proceedings of the Board were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Clerk then certified that notice of this meeting had been given to the Sarpy City Clerk at least seven days prior to the time set by the Board of Trustees for this meeting, said Certificate being attached to these minutes and made a part hereof by this reference incorporated herein.

The Clerk then announced that the last publication of the notice of this meeting was more than five days prior to the time set by the Board of Trustees for public hearing, as set forth in the Proof of Publication. The Clerk further announced that notice had been posted in three conspicuous places within the District and filed his Certificate to that effect, said Certificate being attached to these minutes and made a part hereof by this reference.

The Clerk then stated that no petition opposing the Resolution of Necessity had been filed by any of the property owners within the District nor by any other person and no person appeared at the meeting or made any objections to the proposed Resolution of Necessity.

The Trustees Dennis Janes, Larry Duckworth, and Jeffrey Teig then voted “aye” and passed and adopted the proposed Resolution of Advisability and Necessity, being the same Resolution adopted in form at the meeting of the Board of Trustees held on February 24, 2015, which Resolution is set forth in full in the Proof of Publication attached hereto; the Trustees then passed the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 133 of Sarpy County, Nebraska that the Resolution of Necessity for the 2015 Paving Repairs be and hereby is approved as proposed at the meeting of the Board of Trustees held on April 8, 2015.

The chairman then presented the Proof of Publication for the Notice to Contractors for the 2015 Paving Repairs, to the effect that said Notice to Contractors had been published in the Bellevue Leader for three consecutive weeks on March 4th, March 11th, and March 18th, 2015.

The Clerk then presented the list of bids and bidders for the 2015 Paving Repairs, said bids having been received on March 25, 2015, and presented together with a letter of recommendation of the engineers for the District, and the Clerk was directed to attach a copy of the letter of recommendation together with a copy of the bid tabulation to these minutes, After reviewing the letter of recommendation submitted by the engineers and determining that each of the bids was accompanied by the required bid bond and/or certified check, contract and maintenance bond in the amount of 100% of the contract price, it was determined that the recommendation of the engineers was that the bid of Elkhorn Valley Contractors LLC, the low bidder in the amount of \$34,362.00 be accepted. After discussion, the following resolution was then duly made, seconded and upon a roll call vote of “aye” by the Trustees was duly adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 133 of Sarpy County, Nebraska that the bid of Elkhorn Valley Contractos LLC for the construction of 2015 Paving Repairs in the amount of \$34,362.00 be and hereby is accepted and that the Chairman and Clerk be there and hereby authorized and directed to execute the contract submitted in construction with said bid on behalf of the District.

The Chair then presented the following statements for payment from the General Fund Account of the District and the Clerk was directed to attach a copy of said statement to these minutes:

The Chair then presented the following statements for payment from the Construction Fund Account of the District and the Clerk was directed to attach a copy of said statement to these minutes:

Then, upon a motion duly made, seconded and upon a roll call vote of "aye" by the Trustee Dennis Janes, Jeff Teig and Larry Duckworth, the following Resolutions were unanimously adopted:

RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 133 of Sarpy County, Nebraska that the Chair and Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to execute and deliver Warrants Nos. 1275 through 1279, of the District, dated the date of this meeting, to the following payees, for the following services and in the following amounts, said warrants to draw interest at the rate of 6% per annum, Warrants Nos. 1275 through 1278 to be payable from the General Fund Account of the District and to be redeemed no later than three (3) years of the date hereof, being April 8, 2018(the "**General Fund Warrants**"), and Warrants No. 1279 through to be payable from the Construction Fund Account of the District (interest payable on September 1st of each year) and to be redeemed no later than five (5) years of the date hereof being April 8, 2020 (the "**Construction Fund Warrants**"), subject to extension of said maturity date by order of the District Court of Sarpy County, Nebraska after notice is given as required by law, to-wit:

- c) Warrant No. 1275 for \$395.00 payable to Commercial Mowing for trash removal.

- d) Warrant No. 1276 for \$184.70 payable to Larry Duckworth for clerk fees for the months of March and April (net).
- e) Warrant No. 1277 for \$30.60 payable to Fullenkamp, Doyle & Jobeun Trust Account for IRS withholdings.
- f) Warrant No. 1278 for \$4,723.00 payable to Chastain Otis for policy renewals.
- i) Warrant No. 1279 for \$5,000.00 payable to D.A. Davidson & Co., for Municipal Advisor services.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 133 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the District hereby finds and determines and covenants, warrants and agrees as follows in connection with the issuance of the Construction Fund Warrants: (i) the improvements and/or facilities being financed by the Construction Fund Warrants are for essential governmental functions and are designed to serve members of the general public on an equal basis; (ii) all said improvements have from the time of their first acquisition and construction been owned, are owned and are to be owned by the District or another political subdivision; (iii) to the extent special assessments have been or are to be levied for any of said improvements, such special assessments have been or are to be levied under Nebraska law as a matter of general application to all property specially benefited by said improvements in the District; (iv) the development of the land in the District is for residential or commercial use and the development of the land in the District for sale and occupation by the general public has proceeded and is proceeding with reasonable speed; (v) other than any incidental use of said improvements by a developer during the initial period of development of said improvements, there have been, are and will be no persons with rights to use such improvements other than as members of the general public; (vi) none of the proceeds of said Construction Fund Warrants have been or will be loaned to any private person or entity; and (vii) and the District does not reasonably expect to sell or otherwise dispose of said improvements and/or facilities, in whole or in part, prior to the last maturity of the Construction Fund Warrants.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 133 of Sarpy County, Nebraska that the District covenants and agrees concerning the Construction Fund Warrants that: (i) it will comply with all applicable provisions of the Code, including Sections 103 and 141 through 150, necessary to maintain the exclusion from gross income for federal income tax purposes of the interest on the Construction Fund Warrants and (ii) it will not use or permit the use of any proceeds of the Construction Fund Warrants or any other funds of the District nor take or permit any other action, or fail to take any action, if any such action or failure to take action would adversely affect the exclusion from gross income of the interest on the Construction Fund Warrants. In

addition, the District will adopt such other resolutions and take such other actions as may be necessary to comply with the Code and with all other applicable future laws, regulations, published rulings and judicial decisions, in order to ensure that the interest on the Construction Fund Warrants will remain excluded from federal gross income, to the extent any such actions can be taken by the District.

The District covenants and agrees that (i) it will comply with all requirements of Section 148 of the Code to the extent applicable to the Construction Fund Warrants, (ii) it will use the proceeds of the Construction Fund Warrants as soon as practicable and with all reasonable dispatch for the purposes for which the Construction Fund Warrants are issued, and (iii) it will not invest or directly or indirectly use or permit the use of any proceeds of the Construction Fund Warrants or any other funds of the District in any manner, or take or omit to take any action, that would cause the Construction Fund Warrants to be “arbitrage bonds” within the meaning of Section 148(a) of the Code.

The District covenants and agrees that it will pay or provide for the payment from time to time of all amounts required to be rebated to the United States pursuant to Section 148(f) of the Code and any Regulations applicable to the Construction Fund Warrants from time to time. This covenant shall survive payment in full of the Construction Fund Warrants. The District specifically covenants to pay or cause to be paid to the United States, the required amounts of rebatable arbitrage at the times and in the amounts as determined by reference to the Code and the Regulations. Pursuant to the “small issuer exception” set forth below, the District does not believe the Construction Fund Warrants will be subject to rebate.

The District covenants and agrees that (to the extent within its power or direction) it will not use any portion of the proceeds of the Construction Fund Warrants, including any investment income earned on such proceeds, directly or indirectly, in a manner that would cause any Construction Fund Warrant to be a “private activity bond”.

The District makes the following representations in connection with the exception for small governmental units from the arbitrage rebate requirements under Section 148(f) (4) (D) of the Code:

- (i) the District is a governmental unit under Nebraska law with general taxing powers;
- (ii) none of the Construction Fund Warrants is a private activity bond as defined in Section 141 of the Code;

(iii) ninety-five percent or more of the net proceeds of the Construction Fund Warrants are to be used for local governmental activities of the District;

(iv) the aggregate face amount of all tax-exempt obligations (other than “private activity bonds,” but including any tax-exempt lease-purchase agreements) to be issued by the District during the current calendar year is not reasonably expected to exceed \$5,000,000; and

(v) the District (including all subordinate entities thereof) will not issue in excess of \$5,000,000 of tax-exempt indebtedness (other than “private activity bonds,” but including any tax-exempt lease-purchase agreements) during the current calendar year without first obtaining an opinion of nationally recognized counsel in the area of municipal finance that the excludability of the interest on the Construction Fund Warrants from gross income for federal tax purposes will not be adversely affected thereby.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 133 of Sarpy County, Nebraska that the District hereby covenants, warrants and agrees that to the extent that it may lawfully do so, the District hereby designates the Construction Fund Warrants as its “qualified tax exempt obligations” under Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i)(III) of the Code.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 133 of Sarpy County, Nebraska that this and the preceding Resolutions are hereby adopted as the Certificate with Respect to Arbitrage of the District pertaining to the Construction Fund Warrants and the District hereby further certifies, as of the date of the registration of the Construction Fund Warrants with Sarpy County, Nebraska as follows:

1. The District reasonably anticipates that a portion of the monies in its Bond Fund will be expended for payment of principal of and interest on the bonds and/or construction fund warrants of the District within 12 months after receipt of such monies. The District hereby establishes a reserve fund within its Bond Fund in connection with the issuance of the Construction Fund Warrants in the amount equal to the least of (i) 10% of the stated principal amount of the Construction Fund Warrants, (ii) the maximum annual debt service due on the Construction Fund Warrants during any fiscal year, or (iii) 125% of the average annual debt service for the Construction Fund Warrants over the term of such


warrants. That amount that is currently held in the District's Bond Fund which exceeds the amount to be expended for payment of principal and interest on the bonds and/or construction fund warrants of the District within 12 months after receipt of such monies, plus that amount arrived at pursuant to the immediately preceding sentence, will not be invested in any securities or any other investment obligations which bear a yield, as computed in accordance with the actuarial method, in excess of the yield on the Construction Fund Warrants.

2. To the best of their knowledge, information, and belief, the above expectations are reasonable.
3. The District has not been notified of any listing of it by the Internal Revenue Service as an issuer that may not certify its debt.
4. This Certificate is being passed, executed and delivered pursuant to Section 1.148-2 (b) (2) of the Income Tax Regulations under the Code (the "**Regulations**").

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 133 of Sarpy County, Nebraska the District hereby authorizes and directs the Chair or Clerk to file or cause to be filed, when due, an information reporting form pursuant to Section 149(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "**Code**"), pertaining to the [Construction Fund Warrants] and the [General Fund Warrants];

No opinion of nationally recognized counsel in the area of municipal finance has been delivered with respect to the treatment of interest on the General Fund Warrants. Purchasers of the General Fund Warrants are advised to consult their tax advisors as to the tax consequences of purchasing or holding the General Fund Warrants.

There being no further business before the Board, the Chair adjourned the meeting.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 133 of Sarpy County, Nebraska find and determine that it is advisable and necessary for the District to perform street repairs within the boundaries of the District, said improvement to be designated as 2015 Street Repairs and shall be constructed as follows:

2015 PAVING REPAIR

The following is a description of work to be performed in the construction of the above project.

Remove existing pavement and replace with 9" uniform thickness PCC paving in the following locations:

In 134th Street

At a point 70 feet north and 12 feet east of the intersection of the centerlines of 134th Street and Lillian Street, remove and replace 26 square yards of pavement.

Also, at a point 50 feet north and 12 feet west of the intersection of the centerlines of 134th Street and Lillian Street, remove and replace 42 square yards of pavement.

Also, at a point 20 feet north of the intersection of the centerlines of 134th Street and Lillian Street, remove and replace 12 square yards of pavement.

Also, at a point 20 feet south of the intersection of the centerlines of 134th

Street and Lillian Street, remove and replace 62 square yards of pavement.

Also, at a point 80 feet south of the intersection of the centerlines of 134th Street and Lillian Street, remove and replace 33 square yards of pavement.

Also, at a point 80 feet north of the intersection of the centerlines of 134th Street and Margo Court, remove and replace 18 square yards of pavement.

Also, at a point 15 feet north of the intersection of the centerlines of 134th Street and Margo Street, remove and replace 10 square yards of pavement.

Also, at the intersection of the centerlines of 134th Street and Chandler Street, remove and replace 110 square yards of pavement.

In 137th Avenue

At a point 40 feet south of the intersection of the centerlines of 137th Avenue and Lillian Street, remove and replace 18 square yards of pavement.

In Lillian Street

At a point 10 feet north and 40 feet east of the north intersection of the centerlines of Lillian Street and 134th Street, remove and replace 22 square yards of pavement.

Also, at a point 60 feet west of the south intersection of the centerlines of Lillian Street and 134th Street, remove and replace 16 square yards of pavement.

In Margo Street

At a point 55 feet west of the intersection of the centerlines of Margo Street and 134th Street, remove and replace 12 square yards of pavement.

In Chandler Street

At a point 35 feet west of the intersection of the centerlines of Chandler Street and 134th Street, remove and replace 11 square yards of pavement.

Also, at a point 300 feet west of the intersection of the centerlines of Chandler Street and 136th Street, remove and replace 62 square yards of pavement.

The above-described work is to include removing and replacing PCC integral curb and gutter, repair of subgrade, adjusting manhole rings and covers to grade, sodding, and all other work necessary or incidental to the construction of 2015 Paving Repair in accordance with the plans and specifications.

The outer boundaries of the area which may be subject to special assessments are the same as the outer boundaries of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 133 of Sarpy County, Nebraska.

Plans and Specifications for said improvement have been prepared by Thompson, Dreessen & Domer, Inc., engineers for the District and said engineers have filed with the Clerk of the District, prior to the first publication of this Resolution, an estimate of the total costs of said improvement, including engineering fees, legal fees, fiscal fees, interest and other miscellaneous costs, which estimate is in the sum of \$48,126.00.

To pay the cost of said improvement the Board of Trustees shall have the power to issue negotiable bonds of the District after such improvements have been completed and accepted; said bonds to be called "Sanitary and Improvement District Bonds" and shall be payable and bear interest as provided by the Statutes of the State of Nebraska.

The Board of Trustees shall assess to the extent of special benefits, the cost of such improvements upon properties specially benefitted thereby. All special assessments which may be levied upon the properties specially benefitted by such improvements shall, when collected, be set aside and constitute a sinking fund for the payment of interest and principal of said bonds. The District shall also cause to be levied annually a tax upon the assessed value of all of the taxable property in the District except intangible property, which together with said sinking fund de-

rived from special assessments shall be sufficient to meet payment of the interest and principal of said bonds as the same become due; said tax shall be known as the Sanitary and Improvement District Tax and shall be payable annually in money.

If a petition opposing this Resolution, signed by property owners representing a majority of the front footage which may become subject to assessment for the cost of the improvements as set forth herein, is filed with the Clerk of the District within three (3) days before the date of the hearing on this Resolution, this Resolution shall not be passed.





Elkhorn Valley Contractors LLC of Valley, Nebraska, was the low bidder in the amount of \$34,362.00.
