**Minutes of Meeting of Board of Trustees
November 10, 2016**

A meeting of the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 162 of Sarpy County, Nebraska was convened in open and public session on November 10, 2016 at 3:00 p.m. at the Chalco Hills Recreation Area Visitor's Center, 8901 South 154th Street, Omaha, Nebraska.

Present were: Chairman Richard Hansen, Clerk Nancy Wackerhagen and Trustees James Nichols, Leah Baker and Clinton Strong.

Absent: None

Also present: Engineer Bill Glismann, Attorney Larry Forman and one District resident.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Papillion Times on November 2, 2016, and the Attorney presented proof of publication of said notice, a copy of said proof being attached to these minutes. Advance notice was also given to the members of the Board of Trustees and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of such notice is attached to these Minutes. Notice was also given to the County Clerk of Sarpy County, Nebraska per the attached Certificate of the Clerk of the District. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice given to the Board of Trustees and to the County Clerk. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Chairman called the meeting to order and the Clerk called the roll of Board members.

The Chairman stated the next item of business on the agenda was an announcement in compliance with the Nebraska Open Meetings Act. He stated that in compliance with the provisions of the Act, a copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for inspection at the table at which the Trustees were seated.

The Chairman stated that the next item of business on the agenda was approval of the Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Trustees of October 13 2016. After brief discussion, the Minutes of that meeting were approved as submitted.

The Chairman stated the next item of business on the agenda was resident concerns.

A. Pat Muhs expressed concern with the significant amounts of water coming down the embankment along the east side of 168th Street south of Harrison Street each time the area experiences rainfall of any significance. He stated that while neither the two lots at the north end of 167th Avenue nor the two houses at the south end of the block appear to be experiencing significant amounts of runoff, the other four lots in the middle of the block backing onto 168th Street are all experiencing significant problems in this regard. Extended discussion ensued concerning this situation which has been causing varying degrees of problems to the four affected property owners over the past several years. The Attorney explained that while the SID cannot expend District funds either in the County right-of-way between the edge of the 168th Street paving and the fences of the individual owners abutting the right-of-way, and while the District cannot expend public funds on the private property of the four affected families, the Board members are sympathetic to the plight of those four owners and can approach Dennis Wilson with Sarpy County Public Works to encourage the County to take steps necessary to address this situation, whether with curbing and guttering along the edge of the 168th Street paving or with some sort of berm and swale within the right-of-way to divert as much of the water as is feasible before it causes irreparable harm to the affected homes. The Trustees directed the Attorney to draft a letter to Dennis Wilson requesting immediate action in this regard, supplying copies of the letter to the Trustees, Mr. Glismann and Mr. Muhs.

B. Trustee Baker expressed concern about the stop signs at the three-way stop at 162nd and Timberlane, stating that a couple of the signs are faded and need to be replaced. The Chairman stated that he has two new stop signs in his garage at the present time and he stated that he will take it upon himself to replace the two most faded signs with the new signs on hand.

The Chairman stated the next item of business on the agenda was the Engineer's report. Engineer Bill Glismann distributed to the Trustees copies of his engineering status report dated November 10, 2016, a copy of which is attached to these Minutes, and reported as follows:

A. Mission Creek Channel Reestablishment Phase IV. Valley Corporation has indicated that it will begin work on the project toward the end of November. In the meantime, it will be submitting shop drawings to the Engineers for their review.

B. 2016 Playground Resurfacing Project. Dostals Construction started work on the playground last week and should have the project complete by Thanksgiving. The contractor found

a base of sand under the existing mulch in the project area. The sand under the areas to be seeded will be removed but it will be left in place under the area to be paved and covered with the tiles.

C. Railroad Culvert Channel Erosion. Mr. Glismann distributed to the Trustees copies of a plan and cross-section sheet, a copy of which is attached to these minutes, as submitted from BNSF showing rip-rap designed to prevent further erosion along the north bank of the channel. After receiving the attached plan on October 13, the Engineers took dimensions of the scoured area north of the discharge pipes, submitting their comments to BNSF on October 19. Mr. Glismann stated that he has repeatedly attempted to contact Stephanie Swanson of BNSF both by phone and email but without success. The Attorney inquired as to the adequacy of rip-rap as a solution in lieu of sheet piling to divert the discharged water to the northeast, but Mr. Glismann stated that it was his view that the utilization of rip-rap would be acceptable provided the rip-rap was grouted in place. Trustee Baker inquired as to what needs to be done to get BNSF off dead center. Mr. Glismann stated that it appears it will be necessary to contact the BNSF claims person if progress is to be made. After further discussion, the Trustees directed the Engineer and Attorney to both contact the BNSF claims person to underscore the severity of the problem created by the railroad's work and a request that immediate steps be taken to provide a permanent solution to the situation and to assure that any charges incurred by the District's Engineer and Attorney in pursuing this situation be paid in their entirety by BNSF.

D. Papillion Creek Channel Bank Erosion and Installation of Fencing. Mr. Glismann distributed to the Trustees a plat showing the locations of steep banks along the creek where the Trustees might want to consider placing fencing. He stated that he would not recommend placing fencing in the four areas shown on the plat. He stated that as an alternative, adjacent property owners should be advised to refrain from any further mowing activity in the areas adjacent to the steep slopes, with those folks being informed that fencing would be a very costly alternative which can hopefully be avoided if the areas are allowed to grow up with significant stands of grasses and other vegetation. After further discussion, the Trustees directed the Attorney to draft a letter for mailing to owners of property adjacent to the four steep-banked areas and they directed the Engineer to compile an address list for parties to receive the letter. Further with regard to the four areas shown on the plat, the Trustees determined to take the following actions:

Location A. Cease mowing activity, submit letters to owners of property along Olive Street;

Location B. Stop mowing, no need to send letters;

Location C. Stop mowing, send letter to one property owner informing him that the District will no longer mow the area and asking him to refrain from further mowing activity; and

Location D. After extended discussion, the Trustees determined to place fencing similar to that previously used in other locations in the District along Location D at an estimated cost of approximately \$2,200.00.

Mr. Glismann stated that he would contact the fence contractor to verify that fencing can be placed as needed along Location D for a cost not greatly in excess of the \$2,200.00 estimate.

The Trustees also determined that since less mowing activity will be required of the District's mowing contractor in Locations A, B and C, the mowing contract for 2017 will need to be revised with a reduction in the total area to be mowed by the mowing contractor. Discussion ensued regarding mowing activity on Outlot 4. After further discussion, the Trustees determined that mowing on Outlot 4 should be limited to a 30 foot wide strip, with the Engineer recalculating the area of that outlot to be mowed. Mr. Glismann distributed to the Trustees copies of an additional diagram showing the portions of Outlot 4 to be impacted by this action.

The Chairman stated that the next item of business on the agenda was the Attorney's report. Larry Forman reported as follows:

A. Dumping of Yard Waste in Property Abutting Creek. Mr. Forman stated that a letter had been sent to the offending property owner. Trustee Baker stated that the property owner had not taken any action in response to the letter. After further discussion, the Trustees determined that Alex Toole of Lawn Care for Less should be directed to clean up the area in question, submitting a separate bill for that work so it can be submitted to the property owner for payment, with the subject property being subjected to a lien if the bill is not promptly paid. On a related point, Trustee Strong stated that he had observed large piles of yard waste deposited at other locations in property abutting the creek. The Trustees directed the Attorney to submit a letter to the violating property owner and Mr. Strong stated that he would furnish the attorney with the name and address of the party involved.

It was also reported that a number of hanging limbs have been observed in trees which could pose a hazard to persons utilizing the District's trails. Trustee Baker volunteered to contact Mr. Toole to remove these items unless he is unable to do so in which case she will contact Terry Hughes Tree Service to perform that work.

B. Citation of Statute Prohibiting Dumping of Yard Waste in Property Abutting Creek.

Mr. Forman referenced his email to the Trustees identifying the applicable statute as §404 of the Clean Water Act.

The Chairman stated the next item of business on the agenda was payment of bills. The Chairman presented the following statement for payment through the District's general fund:





BOARD MEETING 11/10/2016

A **Mission Creek Channel Bank Repair Phase IV– South of Audrey Circle**

- Valley Corp has indicated they would plan to start near end of November.
- Valley Corp has been submitting shop drawing info for review.

B **Playground Surfacing**

- Dostals Construction started last week on the playground and intend to be done by Thanksgiving.
- They found a base of sand under the existing mulch. They are removing the sand under the areas that will be seeded and leaving it under the area that will be paved and tiled.

C **Railroad Culvert – Channel Erosion**

- BNSF sent us a drawing on 10/13 which showed rip rap armoring the north bank. It did not address the scour on the drawing. Russ & I took dimensions of the scoured area and made comments on the BNSF drawing and returned them to BNSF on 10/19. I contacted BNSF once a week to check on status of the drawings & comments and would get a reply that their engineer is working on it and will get us something shortly. I finally got a drawing yesterday and all it did was draw a new ground line under the rip rap based upon our sketch and note it would be filled with soil. I tried calling Stephanie Swanson of BNSF yesterday but she was out of town.

D. Not seen

Papillion Creek Channel Bank Erosion

- Russ and I reviewed the channel banks along Papillion Creek to see if there were any areas where the mowed lawn areas of the outlot came up to steep vertical bank areas. We have identified 5 areas as possible safety hazards.
- These areas could be addressed by not mowing so close to the bank to create a buffer so someone would not be able to run right up to the edge of the bank accidentally.
- For the location of the significant channel bank erosion discussed at the last Board Meeting, we discussed installing a fence. The cost of the chain link fence would be approx. \$2,200 based upon the prices from the project last spring.
- Also there are other areas of the outlot along the Papillion Creek that are currently being mowed which could be left unmowed.



Mr. Chairman and Members of the Board:

At the October Board meeting, I was directed to determine what federal statute was being violated by persons dumping yard waste on the ground abutting Mission Creek and the Papillion Creek lying within the boundaries of SID 162.

§404 of the Clean Water Act sets forth the conditions applicable to Department of the Army Nationwide Permit #13 authorizing the performance of work in proximity to Mission Creek. Under the terms of the permit, the native grasses are to be maintained in their native state; mowing of those grasses is prohibited; and dumping of any material is prohibited. Unauthorized placement of fill material is also prohibited and yard waste is included in the broad definition of fill material.
