

**MINUTES OF MEETING OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES
OF SANITARY AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 189
OF SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA**

A meeting of the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 189 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 9:00 a.m. on May 4, 2011, at 10064 South 134 Street, Omaha, Nebraska. Present were: Trustees Rudolph R. Mudra, Carolyn T. Mudra, Mary L. Blair, William J. Whitmore and Bruce Meyers. Absent: None. Also present was Attorney James F. Kasher.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in *The Papillion Times*, Papillion, Nebraska, on April 20 and 27, 2011, a copy of the Proof of Publication being attached to these minutes. Notice of this meeting was sent to the Sarpy County Clerk, Papillion, Nebraska, not less than seven (7) days prior to the date of this meeting. Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members of the Board of Trustees, and a copy of their Acknowledgment of Receipt of Notice is attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the published notice and in the notice to the Trustees of this meeting. All proceedings of the Board were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The undersigned Clerk hereby certifies that these minutes were written and available for public inspection within ten (10) working days after the date of said meeting.

After calling the meeting to order and completion of roll call, the Chairman publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review and indicated the location of such copy in the room where the meeting was being held.

The Chairman directed the Board's attention to Agenda Item No. 3, Engineer's Report.

Public hearing on resolution of necessity for Storm Sewer 2011: The Chairman reported that it had been necessary to make a slight adjustment in the publication and hearing dates set at the previous meeting for the Storm Sewer 2011 project due to the fact that *The Papillion Times* recently changed the date of its weekly publication from Thursday to Wednesday. Thereupon, the following resolution was duly moved by Trustee Bruce Meyers and seconded by Trustee Carolyn T. Mudra, to-wit:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 189 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the change of this meeting date to May 4, as well as the changes of the dates of publication of the Resolution of Necessity to April 20 and 27, and the Notice to Contractors on April 6, 13, 20 and 27, be and hereby are ratified, confirmed and approved.

On roll call on the foregoing resolution, the following Trustees voted aye: Rudolph R. Mudra, Carolyn T. Mudra, Mary L. Blair, William J. Whitmore and Bruce Meyers; voting nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution to be duly carried and adopted.

The Chairman presented for the Board's consideration the Proof of Publication of the proposed resolution, together with a Certification on posting said resolution in three conspicuous places within the District, all as authorized by the Board at its meeting held on February 18, 2011. The Clerk certified to the Board that no petition signed by any owners of property within the District opposing the proposed resolution had been filed with her as Clerk. No owner or owners of property appeared at the meeting to object to the proposed Storm Sewer 2011 project. After full discussion, the following resolution was duly moved by Trustee Bruce Meyers and seconded by Trustee William J. Whitmore as follows, to-wit:

RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 189 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the resolution of necessity proposed by the Board at its meeting held on February 18, 2011, for construction of Storm Sewer 2011 be and hereby is passed, verbatim as proposed.

FURTHER RESOLVED that said Board does herewith order the construction of Storm Sewer 2011.

On roll call on the foregoing resolution, the following Trustees voted aye: Rudolph R. Mudra, Carolyn T. Mudra, Mary L. Blair, William J. Whitmore and Bruce Meyers; voting nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution to be duly carried and adopted.

The Chairman then presented for the Board's consideration the various bids received from contractors on April 28, 2011 for the construction of Storm Sewer 2011, such bids having been submitted in response to published Notice to Contractors (Proof of Publication of said Notice being attached to these minutes). The low bid was submitted by Jochim Precast Concrete Co., Inc. of Papillion, Nebraska, in the sum of \$15,320.00. The Engineers recommended that said low bid be accepted. After full discussion, the following resolution was duly moved by Trustee Bruce Meyers and seconded by Trustee William J. Whitmore, to-wit:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 189 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the bid submitted by Jochim Precast Concrete Co., Inc. for construction of Storm Sewer 2011, in the sum of \$15,320.00, be and hereby is accepted; that the Chairman and Clerk be and hereby are authorized to enter into a written contract in the foregoing amount with said contractor on behalf of the District, provided that said contractor furnish the certificate of insurance and the bonds required by the specifications for the project.

On roll call on the foregoing resolution, the following Trustees voted aye: Rudolph R. Mudra, Carolyn T. Mudra, Mary L. Blair, William J. Whitmore and Bruce Meyers; voting nay thereon were the following Trustees: None. The Chairman then declared said resolution to be duly carried and adopted.

The Chairman then directed the Board's attention to Agenda Item No. 4, Payment of Bills, and presented for the Board's consideration the following bills, statements and invoices. In connection with the invoices from Lanoha Nurseries and Gilliland's Lawns, it was pointed out by the Chairman that the mowing and tree installation and maintenance services were performed on SID property. After careful review of same and full discussion, the following resolution was duly moved by Trustee Carolyn T. Mudra and seconded by Trustee Mary L. Blair, to-wit:

RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 189 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the Chairman and Clerk be and they hereby are authorized and directed to execute and deliver Warrant Nos. 1245 through 1249 of the District, dated the date of this meeting, to the following payees and in the following amounts, said Warrant Nos. 1245 through 1248 to be drawn on the General Fund Account of the District and to bear interest at the rate of seven percent (7%) per annum and Warrant No. 1249 to be drawn on the Construction Fund Account of the District and to bear interest at the rate of seven percent (7%) per annum (interest to be payable on May 10 of each year, as to the Construction Fund Warrants only), and to be redeemed no later than the dates noted below, subject to extension of said maturity date, (for Construction Fund Warrants only), by order of the District Court of Sarpy County, Nebraska, after notice is given as required by law, to-wit:

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 189 of Sarpy County,

Nebraska, that both they and the district hereby find and determine and covenant, warrant and agree as follows: the improvements and/or facilities being financed or refinanced by the above Warrants are for essential governmental functions and are designed to serve members of the general public on an equal basis; all said improvements have from the time of their first acquisition and construction been owned, are owned and are to be owned by the District or another political subdivision; to the extent special assessments have been or are to be levied for any of said improvements, such special assessments have been or are to be levied under Nebraska law as a matter of general application to all property specially benefited by said improvements in the District; the development of the land in the District is for residential or commercial use and the development of the land in the District for sale and occupation by the general public has proceeded and is proceeding with reasonable speed; other than any incidental use of said improvements by a developer during the initial period of development of said improvements, there have been, are and will be no persons with rights to use such improvements other than as members of the general public; none of the proceeds of said Bonds or any refinanced indebtedness have been or will be loaned to any private person or entity; the District hereby authorizes and directs the Chairperson or Clerk to file or cause to be filed, when due, an information reporting form pursuant to Section 149(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, pertaining to the above Warrants; and the District does not reasonably expect to sell or otherwise dispose of said improvements and/or facilities, in whole or in part, prior to the last maturity of the above Warrants.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 189 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the District hereby covenants, warrants and agrees as follows: (a) to take all actions necessary under current federal law to maintain the tax exempt status (as to taxpayers generally) of interest on the above Warrants; and (b) to the extent that it may lawfully do so, the District hereby designates the above Warrants as its "qualified tax exempt obligations" under Section 265(b)(3)(B)(ii) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and covenants and warrants that the District does not reasonably expect to issue warrants or bonds or other obligations aggregating in the principal amount of more than \$5,000,000 during the calendar year in which the above Warrants are to be issued.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 189 of Sarpy County,

Nebraska that this and the preceding Resolutions are hereby adopted as the Certificate with Respect to Arbitrage of the District pertaining to the above Warrants and the District and the Chairman and Clerk of the District hereby further certify, as of the date of the registration of the above Warrants with the County Treasurer of Sarpy County, Nebraska, as follows:

1. No separate reserve or replacement fund has been or will be established with respect to the above Warrants. The District reasonably anticipates that monies in its Bond Fund reasonably attributable to the above Warrants in excess of the lesser of: (a) 10% of the net principal proceeds of the above Warrants, (b) the maximum annual debt service due on the above Warrants, or (c) 125% of average annual debt service due on the above Warrants will be expended for payment of principal of and interest on the above Warrants within 13 months after receipt of such monies. That amount which is currently held in the District's Bond Fund which exceeds the amount which is to be expended for payment of principal and interest on the above Warrants within 13 months after receipt of such monies, plus that amount arrived at pursuant to the immediately preceding sentence, will not be invested in any securities or any other investment obligations which bear a yield, as computed in accordance with the actuarial method, in excess of the yield on the above warrants.

2. To the best of their knowledge, information and belief, the above expectations are reasonable.


3. The District has not been notified of any listing of it by the Internal Revenue Service as an issuer that may not certify its bonds.

4. This Certificate is being passed, executed and delivered pursuant to Sections 1.148-2(b)(2) of the Income Tax Regulations under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.


