A meeting of the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 220 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 12:30 p.m. on the 13th day of September, 2010, at 17809 Pacific Street, Omaha, Nebraska.

Present were: Herbert L. Freeman, Marcy Knobbe, Michael L. Riedmann and John R. Christiansen. Also present was John Q. Bachman, attorney for the District.

Absent: Craig A. Finnestad.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Bellevue Leader on September 8, 2010, a copy of the proof of publication being attached to these minutes. Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members of the Board of Trustees, and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of notice is attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the published notice and in the notice to the Trustees of this meeting. All proceedings of the Board were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public. The agenda was at all times available at the office for the District at 10250 Regency Circle, Suite 300, Omaha, Nebraska 68114.

The meeting was called to order by the undersigned presiding as Chairman. Upon roll call, all of the Trustees were present with the exception of Craig A. Finnestad.

The Chairman publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review and indicated the location of such copy in the room where the meeting was being held.

The Clerk next presented in accordance with the provisions of Neb. R.R.S. Section 77-1601.02, the publication concerning the Board of Trustees recommendation that the property tax request for tax year 2010-2011 be set at a different amount than the 2009-2010 tax request. The Clerk further reported that no person had appeared at the meeting in response to such hearing notice. The Clerk was directed to attach a copy of such notice to the minutes of these proceedings.

After discussion and upon a motion duly made and seconded, and upon a roll call vote, the Trustees, Herbert L. Freeman, Marcy Knobbe, Michael L. Riedmann and John R. Christiansen, voted "Aye" with none voting "Nay" with the following resolution being thereby adopted and approved:

RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 220 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that it is advisable that the property tax request for tax year 2010-2011 be set at a different amount than the 2009-2010 tax request as set out in the proof of publication attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, as follows:



MINUTES OF MEETING

A meeting of the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 220 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 12:35 p.m. on the 13th day of September, 2010, at 17809 Pacific Street, Omaha, Nebraska.

Present were: Herbert L. Freeman, Marcy Knobbe, Michael L. Riedmann and John R. Christiansen. Also present was John Q. Bachman, attorney for the District.

Absent: Craig A. Finnestad.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Bellevue Leader on September 8, 2010, a copy of the proof of publication being attached to these minutes. Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members of the Board of Trustees, and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of notice is attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the published notice and in the notice to the Trustees of this meeting. All proceedings of the Board were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public. The agenda was at all times available at the office for the District at 10250 Regency Circle, Suite 300, Omaha, Nebraska 68114.

The meeting was called to order by the undersigned presiding as Chairman. Upon roll call, all of the Trustees with the exception of Craig A. Finnestad.

The Chairman publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review and indicated the location of such copy in the room where the meeting was being held.

The Clerk first reported in accordance with the provisions of Neb. R.R.S. Section 13-501 through 13-513, the District's certified public accountants were directed to prepare a proposed budget and further that the Clerk attended to the required publication of notice with regard to the budgetary hearing to be held by the Board of Trustees. The Clerk had been directed to give the appropriate notices in accordance with the Nebraska Budget Act and that a budgetary hearing for the District be held on the 13th day of September, 2010, at 17809 Pacific Street, Omaha, Nebraska.

The Clerk next presented the publication of this budgetary hearing as presented in the Bellevue Leader. The Clerk next reported that such notice of the budgetary hearing along with a budget summary had been published in accordance with law. The Clerk further reported that it appeared that no person had appeared at the meeting in response to such notice of the budgetary hearing and the Clerk was directed to attach a copy of such notice to the minutes of these proceedings.

After a lengthy discussion and upon a motion duly made and seconded, and upon a roll call vote, the Trustees, Herbert L. Freeman, Marcy Knobbe, Michael L. Riedmann and John R. Christiansen, voted "Aye" with none voting "Nay" with the following resolution being thereby adopted and approved:

RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 220 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the budget and tax levy as tentatively set forth be adopted as the final budget and levy in accordance with Exhibit "A" attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

Further that the Clerk of the District be directed to file a copy of the adopted budget with the levying board of the State Auditor's office as well as certifying the levy to the Sarpy County officials as well as attaching a proof of publication to such adopted budget.

With the budget for the District having been adopted, the Chairman then stated that it would be appropriate at this time to levy the tax in accordance with the budget statement. After a full and complete discussion and upon a motion duly made and seconded, and upon the following roll call vote, the Trustees, Herbert L. Freeman, Marcy Knobbe, Michael L. Riedmann and John R. Christiansen, voted "Aye" with none voting "Nay" thereby passing and adopting the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that Sanitary and Improvement District No. 220 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, levy and collect for the year 2010-2011 a tax of \$0.750000 per One Hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$100.00) actual valuation of taxable property in the District, except intangible property, said tax to be credited to the appropriate fund as indicated below:

\$0.150000 on each One Hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$100.00) actual valuation to be credited to the General Fund of the District and thereby collect \$104,136.45 in taxes to be credited to this fund; and

\$0.600000 on each One Hundred and No/100 Dollars (\$100.00) actual valuation to be credited to the Construction (Bond) Fund of the District and thereby collect \$416,545.79 in taxes to be credited to this fund.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of this District be and hereby is directed to deliver and file with the County Clerk of Sarpy County, Nebraska and the Auditor of Public Accounts, a copy of this resolution.

There were next presented miscellaneous bills, invoices, statements, and recommendations for the Board's consideration.

There were next presented statements from Great Western Bank for registrar and paying agent services as follows: (i) in connection with the 2005 bond issue in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty and no/100 Dollars (\$250.00); and (ii) in connection with the 2007 bond issue in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty and no/100 Dollars (\$250.00); said statements being in the aggregate amount of Five Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$500.00).

There was next presented correspondence from Thompson, Dreessen & Dorner, Inc., engineers for the District, presenting and recommending payment in favor of Nebraska's Best Lawn & Landscape, LLC in connection with park and public area maintenance within the District, Invoice No. 4469, in the amount of Eight Thousand Three Hundred Sixteen and no/100 Dollars (\$8,316.00).

There was next presented correspondence from Thompson, Dreessen & Dorner, Inc., engineers for the District, presenting and recommending payment in favor of Jochim Precast Concrete for trash and debris removal in connection with storm sewer maintenance, Invoice No. 25222, in the amount of Five Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$500.00).

There was next presented correspondence from Thompson, Dreessen & Dorner, Inc., engineers for the District, presenting and recommending payment in favor of A Cut Above Landscaping LLC for mowing and trimming on July 27, 2010, Invoice No. 9554, in the amount of Three Thousand Four Hundred Fifty and no/100 Dollars (\$3,450.00).

There was next presented correspondence from Thompson, Dreessen & Dorner, Inc., engineers for the District, presenting and recommending payment in favor of Stanek Construction Company for street sign maintenance, Invoice No. 10-067, in the amount of One Hundred Ninety and no/100 Dollars (\$190.00).

There was next presented correspondence from Thompson, Dreessen & Dorner, Inc., engineers for the District, presenting and recommending payment in favor of Turfbuilders Irrigation, Inc. for island irrigation system maintenance, Invoice No. 10-20607, in the amount of Seventy-Two and no/100 Dollars (\$72.00).

There was next presented correspondence from Thompson, Dreessen & Dorner, Inc., engineers for the District, presenting and recommending payment in favor of Great Plains One Call Services, Inc. for line locating services as follows: (i) Invoice No. 610SD220, in the amount of Twenty-Eight and 16/100 Dollars (\$28.16); (ii) Invoice No. 710SD220, in the amount of Fourteen and 08/100 Dollars (\$14.08); and (iii) Invoice No. 810SD220, in the amount of Twenty-Two and 88/100 Dollars (\$22.88); said invoices being in the aggregate amount of Sixty-Five and 12/100 Dollars (\$65.12).

Counsel for the District next informed the Board that the Clerk was entitled to \$100.00 per month. Payment was authorized for twelve (12) months, from September 1, 2009, through August 31, 2010, the Clerk to receive the amount of One Thousand Two Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$1,200.00) less Ninety-One and 80/100 Dollars (\$91.80) to be withheld for income tax purposes; therefore payment to be made to the Clerk in the amount of One Thousand One Hundred Eight and 20/100 Dollars (\$1,108.20).

Counsel for the District next informed the Board that sums were to be placed in the Pansing Hogan Ernst & Bachman LLP Trust Account for purposes of payment of tax on income received by the Clerk of the District, said tax to be in the amount of Ninety-One and 80/100 Dollars (\$91.80).

There was next presented a statement from UNICO Group for clerk bond renewal, Invoice No. 465753, in the amount of One Hundred Seventy and no/100 Dollars (\$170.00).

There was next presented a statement from Lutz & Company, PC, accountants for the District, for completion of annual budget document and progress bill related to the June 30, 2010 audited financial statement, Invoice No. 120816, in the amount of Two Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty and no/100 Dollars (\$2,750.00).

There were next presented statements from Thompson, Dreessen & Dorner, Inc., engineers for the District for miscellaneous engineering services rendered as follows: (i) through July 4, 2010, Invoice No. 88776, in the amount of Two Hundred Eighty-One and 76/100 Dollars (\$281.76); (ii) through July 4, 2010, Invoice No. 88777, in the amount of One Thousand Sixty-Three and 75/100 Dollars (\$1,063.75); (iii) through June 30, 2010, Invoice No. 88778, in the amount of Four Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$400.00); (iv) through August 1, 2010, Invoice No. 89025, in the amount of Three Hundred Fifty-Nine and 57/100 Dollars (\$359.57); (v) through August 1, 2010, Invoice No. 89026, in the amount of One Hundred Seventy-Five and no/100 Dollars (\$175.00); and (vi) through July 31, 2010, Invoice No. 89027, in the amount of Two Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$200.00); said invoices being in the aggregate amount of Two Thousand Four Hundred Eighty and 08/100 Dollars (\$2,480.08).

There was next presented a statement from Pansing Hogan Ernst & Bachman LLP, attorneys for the District, for legal services rendered in miscellaneous District matters through August 31, 2010, in the amount of Fourteen Thousand Five Hundred Four and no/100 Dollars (\$14,504.00), and costs advanced in the amount of One Thousand Ten and 61/100 Dollars (\$1,010.61); said statement being in the aggregate amount of Fifteen Thousand Five Hundred Fourteen and 61/100 Dollars (\$15,514.61).

There were next presented statements from Metropolitan Utilities District for service at the 7006 S. 173rd Street location through August 5, 2010, in the amount of Five Hundred Eighty-Nine and 46/100 Dollars (\$589.46). **The Board directed advance payment to be made in the amount of One Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$1,000.00).**

There were next presented statements from Metropolitan Utilities District for service at the 16802 Edna Street location through July 30, 2010, in the amount of One Hundred One and 80/100 Dollars (\$101.80). **The Board directed advance payment to be made in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty and no/100 Dollars (\$250.00).**

There were next presented statements from Omaha Public Power District, for power service at the 17300 Emiline Street location, as follows: (i) for the billing period June 29, 2010 to July 29, 2010, in the amount of Two Thousand Two Hundred Forty-Five and 83/100 Dollars (2,245.83); and (ii) for the billing period July 29, 2010 to August 30, 2010, in the amount of Two Thousand Two Hundred Forty-Five and 83/100 Dollars (\$2,245.83); said statements being in the aggregate amount of Four Thousand Four Hundred Ninety-One and 66/100 Dollars (\$4,491.66).

RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 220 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the Chairman and Clerk be and they hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver Warrant No. 1502 of the District, dated the date of this meeting, to the following payee and in the following amount, said Warrant to be drawn on the Construction Fund of the District and to draw interest at the rate of seven percent (7%) per annum (interest to be payable on June 1 of each year) and to be redeemed no later than September 13, 2015, subject to extension of said maturity date by order of the District Court of Sarpy County, Nebraska, after notice is given as required by law, to-wit:

Warrant No. 1502, for the amount of Five Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$500.00), payable to Great Western Bank.

FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 220 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the Chairman and Clerk be and they hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver Warrant Nos. 1503 through 1519 of the District, dated the date of this meeting, to the following payees and in the following amounts, said Warrants to be drawn on the General Fund of the District and to draw interest at the rate of seven percent (7%) per annum and to be redeemed no later than March 15, 2013, subject to extension of said maturity date by order of the District Court of Sarpy County, Nebraska, after notice is given as required by law, to-wit:

FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 220 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that both they and the district hereby find and determine and covenant, warrant and agree as follows: the improvements and/or facilities being financed or refinanced by the above Warrants are for essential governmental functions and are designed to serve members of the general public on an equal basis; all said improvements have from the time of their first acquisition and construction been owned, are owned and are to be owned by the District or another political subdivision; to the extent special assessments have been or are to be levied for any of said improvements, such special assessments have been or are to be levied under Nebraska law as a matter of general application to all property specially benefited by said improvements in the District; the development of the land in the District is for residential or commercial use and the development of the land in the District for sale and occupation by the general public has proceeded and is proceeding with reasonable speed; other than any incidental use of said improvements by a developer during the initial period of development of said improvements, there have been, are and will be no persons with rights to use such improvements other than as members of the general public; none of the proceeds of said Bonds or any refinanced indebtedness have been or will be loaned to any private person or entity; the District hereby authorizes and directs the Chairperson or Clerk to file or cause to be filed, when due, an information reporting form pursuant to Section 149(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, pertaining to the above Warrants; and the District does not reasonably expect to sell or otherwise dispose of said improvements and/or facilities, in whole or in part, prior to the last maturity of the above Warrants.

FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 220 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the District hereby covenants, warrants and agrees as follows: (a) to take all actions necessary under current federal law to maintain the tax exempt status (as to taxpayers generally) of interest on the above Warrants; and (b) to the extent that it may lawfully do so, the District hereby designates the above Warrants as its "qualified tax exempt obligations" under Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i)(III) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and covenants and warrants that the District does not reasonably expect to issue warrants or bonds or other obligations aggregating in the principal amount of more than \$5,000,000 during the calendar year in which the above Warrants are to be issued.

FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 220 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that this and the preceding Resolutions are hereby adopted as the Certificate With Respect to Arbitrage of the District pertaining to the above Warrants and the District and the Chairman and Clerk of the District hereby further certify, as of the date of the registration of the above Warrants with the County Treasurer of Sarpy County, Nebraska, as follows:

1. No separate reserve or replacement fund has been or will be established with respect to the above Warrants. The District reasonably anticipates that monies in its Bond Fund reasonably attributable to the above Warrants in excess of the lesser of: (a) ten percent (10%) of the net principal proceeds of the above Warrants, (b) the maximum annual debt service due on the above Warrants, or (c) one

hundred twenty-five percent (125%) of average annual debt service due on the above Warrants will be expended for payment of principal of and interest on the above Warrants within thirteen (13) months after receipt of such monies. That amount which is currently held in the District's Bond Fund which exceeds the amount which is to be expended for payment of principal and interest on the above Warrants within thirteen (13) months after receipt of such monies, plus that amount arrived at pursuant to the immediately preceding sentence, will not be invested in any securities or any other investment obligations which bear a yield, as computed in accordance with the actuarial method, in excess of the yield on the above Warrants.

2. To the best of their knowledge, information and belief, the above expectations are reasonable.

3. The District has not been notified of any listing of it by the Internal Revenue Service as an issuer that may not certify its bonds.


4. This Certificate is being passed, executed and delivered pursuant to Section 1.148-2(b)(2) of the Income Tax Regulations under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

After a general discussion, the Trustees agreed to terminate the services of Thompson, Dreessen & Dorner and request that Lamp, Ryneerson & Associates, Inc. act as District engineers. The attorneys were to so advise Thompson, Dreessen & Dorner and Lamp, Ryneerson & Associates, Inc. with respect to the change in engineers.
