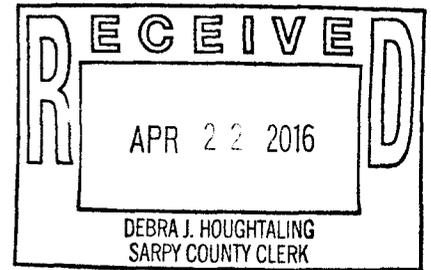


MINUTES OF MEETING
OF
SANITARY AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 240
OF SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA



A meeting of the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 240 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 4:30 p.m. on the 11th day of April, 2016, at 10250 Regency Circle, Suite 300, Omaha, Nebraska.

Present were: Michael E. Freestone, Bob Mitchell, Timothy A. Reick and Marc D. Stodola.

Absent: Mike Palmisano.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Gretna Breeze on April 6, 2016, a copy of the proof of publication being attached to these minutes. Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members of the Board of Trustees, and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of notice is attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the published notice and in the notice to the Trustees of this meeting. All proceedings of the Board were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public. The agenda was at all times available at the office for the District at 10250 Regency Circle, Suite 300, Omaha, Nebraska 68114.

The meeting was called to order. Upon roll call, all of the above referenced Trustees were present.

It was first publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review and indicated the location of such copy in the room where the meeting was being held.

There were next presented miscellaneous bills, invoices, statements, and recommendations for the Board's consideration.

There were next presented statements from HTM Sales Inc., for lift station maintenance and repairs, as follows: (i) Invoice #15-31824-6, in the amount of Three Thousand Four Hundred Thirty-Six and 23/100 Dollars (\$3,436.23), (ii) Invoice #16-33085-1, in the amount of Three Hundred Thirty-Three and 27/100 Dollars (\$333.27), and (iii) Invoice #16-33085-2, in the amount of One Thousand Fifty and no/100 Dollars (\$1,050.00); said statements being in the aggregate amount of Four Thousand Eight Hundred Nineteen and 50/100 Dollars (\$4,819.50).

There was next presented a statement from HSMC - Orizon, accountants for the District, for final billing for audit of financial statements for the year ending June 30, 2015, Invoice #161956, in the amount of Five Thousand and no/10 Dollars (\$5,000.00).

There were next presented statements from One Call Concepts, Inc., for line locates within the District, as follows: (i) Invoice #5120571, in the amount of Eighteen and 55/100 Dollars (\$18.55), (ii) Invoice #6010573, in the amount of Ten and 59/100 Dollars (\$10.59), (iii) Invoice #6020575, in the amount of Thirteen and 23/100 Dollars (\$13.23), and (iv) Invoice #6030574, in the amount of Nineteen and 23/100 Dollars (\$19.23); said statements being in the aggregate amount of Sixty-One and 60/100 Dollars (\$61.60). **The Board next directed advance payment to be made in the amount of One Hundred Fifty and no/100 Dollars (\$150.00).**

There were next presented statements from Lamp, Rynearson & Associates, Inc., engineers for the District, for services rendered in miscellaneous District maintenance matters through January 16, 2016, as

follows: (i) Invoice dated December 31, 2015, in the amount of Two Thousand Two Hundred Twenty-Three and 18/100 Dollars (\$2,223.18), (ii) Invoice dated January 29, 2016, in the amount of Eight Hundred One and 41/100 Dollars (\$801.41), and (iv) invoice dated March 31, 2016, in the amount of Four Hundred Ninety-Eight and 94/100 Dollars (\$498.94); said statements being in the aggregate amount of Three Thousand Five Hundred Twenty-Three and 53/100 Dollars (\$3,523.53).

There was next presented a statement from Tim's Lawn Care LLC, for services rendered in miscellaneous District landscaping maintenance, Invoice #1, in the amount of Eight Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$800.00).

There was next presented correspondence from Lamp, Rynearson & Associates, Inc., authorizing Clean Sweep Commercial Inc., for street sweeping services to be rendered within the District, in the amount of Six Hundred Twenty-Five and no/100 Dollars (\$625.00). **The Board asked that the signed warrant be held in the file until street sweeping services have been performed.**

There was next presented a statement from Pansing Hogan Ernst & Bachman LLP, attorneys for the District, for legal services performed in miscellaneous District matters through March 31, 2016, in the amount of Five Thousand Four Hundred Eighty-Four and no/100 Dollars (\$5,484.00), and costs advanced in the amount of One Hundred Ninety-Three and 84/100 Dollars (\$193.84); said statement being in the aggregate amount of Five Thousand Six Hundred Seventy-Seven and 84/100 Dollars (\$5,677.84).

There were next presented statements from Omaha Public Power District, for lighting at the location 11205 Morgan Circle, from November 5, 2015, through March 7, 2016, in the aggregate amount of Seventy-Three and 87/100 Dollars (\$73.87).

There were next presented statements from Omaha Public Power District, for lift station and street lights, for Account #4672971253, from November 5, 2015, through March 7, 2016, in the aggregate amount of Five Thousand Three Hundred Ninety-Three and 14/100 Dollars (\$5,393.14).

The Clerk next directed the attention of the Board of Trustees to the fact that Ameritas Investment Corp. will purchase Twenty-Six Thousand Sixty-Two and 88/100 Dollars (\$26,062.88) in general fund warrants at this time and that the contracted charge for such purchase of warrants is five percent (5%) or One Thousand Three Hundred Three and 14/100 Dollars (\$1,303.14) in accordance with the financing agreement previously adopted by the Board. The Clerk recommended issuance of a warrant in such amount to Ameritas Investment Corp.

The previously described bills, invoices, recommendations and statements having been presented for the Board's consideration and after review and discussion of such items, the following resolution was duly moved and passed:

RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 240 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the Chairman and Clerk be and they hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver Warrant Nos. 2049 through 2060 of the District, dated the date of this meeting, to the following payees and in the following amounts, said Warrants to be drawn on the General Fund of the District and to draw interest at the rate of seven percent (7%) per annum and to be redeemed no later than April 11, 2019, subject to extension of said maturity date by order of the District Court of Sarpy County, Nebraska, after notice is given as required by law, to-wit:

Warrant No. 2049, for the amount of Four Thousand Eight Hundred Nineteen and 50/100 Dollars (\$4,819.50), payable to HTM Sales Inc.

Warrant No. 2050, for the amount of Five Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$5,000.00), payable to HSMC – Orizon.

Warrant No. 2051, for the amount of One Hundred Fifty and no/100 Dollars (\$150.00), payable to One Call Concepts, Inc.

Warrant No. 2052, for the amount of Three Thousand Five Hundred Twenty-Three and 53/100 Dollars (\$3,523.53), payable to Lamp, Rynearson & Associates, Inc.

Warrant No. 2053, for the amount of Eight Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$800.00), payable to Tim's Lawn Care LLC.

Warrant No. 2054, for the amount of Six Hundred Twenty-Five and no/100 Dollars (\$625.00), payable to Clean Sweep Commercial, Inc.

Warrant No. 2055, for the amount of Five Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$5,000.00), and Warrant No. 2056, for the amount of Six Hundred Seventy-Seven and 84/100 Dollars (\$677.84), payable to Pansing Hogan Ernst & Bachman LLP.

Warrant No. 2057, for the amount of Seventy-Three and 87/100 Dollars (\$73.87), payable to Omaha Public Power District, Account #8891923592.

Warrant No. 2058, for the amount of Five Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$5,000.00), and Warrant No. 2059, for the amount of Three Hundred Ninety-Three and 14/100 Dollars (\$393.14), payable to Omaha Public Power District, Account #4672971253.

Warrant No. 2060, for the amount of One Thousand Three Hundred Three and 14/100 Dollars (\$1,303.14), payable to Ameritas Investment Corp.

FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 240 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that both they and the district hereby find and determine and covenant, warrant and agree as follows: the improvements and/or facilities being financed or refinanced by the above Warrants are for essential governmental functions and are designed to serve members of the general public on an equal basis; all said improvements have from the time of their first acquisition and construction been owned, are owned and are to be owned by the District or another political subdivision; to the extent special assessments have been or are to be levied for any of said improvements, such special assessments have been or are to be levied under Nebraska law as a matter of general application to all property specially benefited by said improvements in the District; the development of the land in the District is for residential or commercial use and the development of the land in the District for sale and occupation by the general public has proceeded and is proceeding with reasonable speed; other than any incidental use of said improvements by a developer during the initial period of development of said improvements, there have been, are and will be no persons with rights to use such improvements other than as

members of the general public; none of the proceeds of said Bonds or any refinanced indebtedness have been or will be loaned to any private person or entity; the District hereby authorizes and directs the Chairperson or Clerk to file or cause to be filed, when due, an information reporting form pursuant to Section 149(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, pertaining to the above Warrants; and the District does not reasonably expect to sell or otherwise dispose of said improvements and/or facilities, in whole or in part, prior to the last maturity of the above Warrants.

FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 240 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the District hereby covenants, warrants and agrees as follows: (a) to take all actions necessary under current federal law to maintain the tax exempt status (as to taxpayers generally) of interest on the above Warrants; and (b) to the extent that it may lawfully do so, the District hereby designates the above Warrants as its "qualified tax exempt obligations" under Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i)(III) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and covenants and warrants that the District does not reasonably expect to issue warrants or bonds or other obligations aggregating in the principal amount of more than \$10,000,000 during the calendar year in which the above Warrants are to be issued.

FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 240 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that this and the preceding Resolutions are hereby adopted as the Certificate With Respect to Arbitrage of the District pertaining to the above Warrants and the District and the Chairman and Clerk of the District hereby further certify, as of the date of the registration of the above Warrants with the County Treasurer of Sarpy County, Nebraska, as follows:

1. No separate reserve or replacement fund has been or will be established with respect to the above Warrants. The District reasonably anticipates that monies in its Bond Fund reasonably attributable to the above Warrants in excess of the lesser of: (a) ten percent (10%) of the net principal proceeds of the above Warrants, (b) the maximum annual debt service due on the above Warrants, or (c) one hundred twenty-five percent (125%) of average annual debt service due on the above Warrants will be expended for payment of principal of and interest on the above Warrants within thirteen (13) months after receipt of such monies. That amount which is currently held in the District's Bond Fund which exceeds the amount which is to be expended for payment of principal and interest on the above Warrants within thirteen (13) months after receipt of such monies, plus that amount arrived at pursuant to the immediately preceding sentence, will not be invested in any securities or any other investment obligations which bear a yield, as computed in accordance with the actuarial method, in excess of the yield on the above Warrants.

2. To the best of their knowledge, information and belief, the above expectations are reasonable.

3. The District has not been notified of any listing of it by the Internal Revenue Service as an issuer that may not certify its bonds.

4. This Certificate is being passed, executed and delivered pursuant to Section 1.148-2(b)(2) of the Income Tax Regulations under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

Discussion was next had concerning SID 278 (Tiburon Ridge) obligation to make contribution to the lift station maintenance costs as outlined in the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement and Addendum thereto. The Board approved the Request for Reimbursement (copy attached) and asked that counsel for the District forward same to the attorney for SID 278.

Additionally, counsel for the District was directed to coordinate with the District's engineers to create a draft of an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for reimbursement for lift station maintenance and costs with SID 308 (Pebblebrooke 2).
