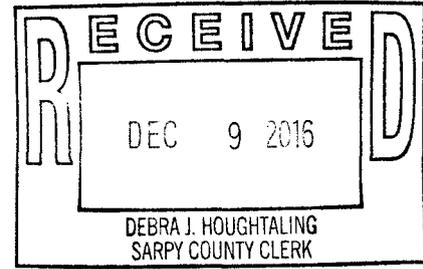


MINUTES OF MEETING  
OF  
SANITARY AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 240  
OF SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA



A meeting of the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 240 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 5:00 p.m. on the 5th day of December, 2016, at 10250 Regency Circle, Suite 300, Omaha, Nebraska.

Present were: Mike Palmisano, Michael E. Freestone, Bob Mitchell, Timothy A. Reick and Marc D. Stodola.

Absent: None.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Gretna Breeze on November 30, 2016, a copy of the proof of publication being attached to these minutes. Notice of this meeting was simultaneously given to all members of the Board of Trustees, and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of notice is attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the published notice and in the notice to the Trustees of this meeting. All proceedings of the Board were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public. The agenda was at all times available at the office for the District at 10250 Regency Circle, Suite 300, Omaha, Nebraska 68114.

The meeting was called to order. Upon roll call, all of the above referenced Trustees were present.

It was first publicly stated to all in attendance that a current copy of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was available for review and indicated the location of such copy in the room where the meeting was being held.

There was next presented correspondence from Ameritas Investment Corp, the District's fiscal agent, indicating that Pershing LLC, needs the amount on the original Warrant broken down into three amounts and issue three new warrants in the aggregate amount of Thirty Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$30,000.00). Upon discussion of this matter, the following resolution was duly made and seconded, whereupon a roll call vote was taken during which the Trustees, Mike Palmisano, Michael E. Freestone, Bob Mitchell, Timothy A. Reick and Marc D. Stodola voted "Aye," with none voting "Nay," thereby approving the following resolution:

RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 240 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that Construction Fund Warrant Nos. 1701, 1702 and 1703 assigned to Pershing LLC, be hereby is canceled.

Upon discussion of this matter, the following resolution was duly made and seconded, whereupon a roll call vote was taken during which the Trustees, Mike Palmisano, Michael E. Freestone, Bob Mitchell, Timothy A. Reick and Marc D. Stodola voted "Aye," with none voting "Nay," thereby approving the following resolution:

There was next presented a statement from HSMC Orizon, for accountants for the District, for services rendered concerning the 2016-17 budget, compilation of state budget form and progress billing for audit of financial statements for the year ending June 30, 2016, Invoice #164604, in the amount of Three Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$3,000.00).

There were next presented statements from Omaha Public Power District, for lift station and street lights, for Account #4672971253, from August 4, 2015, through November 3, 2016, in the aggregate amount of Three Thousand Eight Hundred Fifty-Six and 20/100 Dollars (\$3,856.20).

The Clerk next directed the attention of the Board of Trustees to the fact that Ameritas Investment Corp. will purchase Twenty-Five Thousand Three Hundred Eighty-One and 49/100 Dollars (\$25,381.49) in general fund warrants at this time and that the contracted charge for such purchase of warrants is five percent (5%) or One Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-Nine and 07/100 Dollars (\$1,269.07) in accordance with the financing agreement previously adopted by the Board. The Clerk recommended issuance of a warrant in such amount to Ameritas Investment Corp.

The previously described bills, invoices, recommendations and statements having been presented for the Board's consideration and after review and discussion of such items, the following resolution was duly moved and passed:

FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 240 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that both they and the district hereby find and determine and covenant, warrant and agree as follows: the improvements and/or facilities being financed or refinanced by the above Warrants are for essential governmental functions and are designed to serve members of the general public on an equal basis; all said improvements have from the time of their first acquisition and construction been owned, are owned and are to be owned by the District or another political subdivision; to the extent special assessments have been or are to be levied for any of said improvements, such special assessments have been or are to be levied under Nebraska law as a matter of general application to all property specially benefited by said improvements in the District; the development of the land in the District is for residential or commercial use and the development of the land in the District for sale and occupation by the general public has proceeded and is proceeding with reasonable speed; other than any incidental use of said improvements by a developer during the initial period of development of said improvements, there have been, are and will be no persons with rights to use such improvements other than as members of the general public; none of the proceeds of said Bonds or any refinanced indebtedness have been or will be loaned to any private person or entity; the District hereby authorizes and directs the Chairperson or Clerk to file or cause to be filed, when due, an information reporting form pursuant to Section 149(e) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, pertaining to the above Warrants; and the District does not reasonably expect to sell or otherwise dispose of said improvements and/or facilities, in whole or in part, prior to the last maturity of the above Warrants.

FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 240 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that the District hereby covenants, warrants and agrees as follows: (a) to take all actions necessary under current federal law to maintain the tax exempt status (as to taxpayers generally) of interest on the above Warrants; and (b) to the extent that it may lawfully do so, the District hereby designates the above Warrants as its "qualified tax exempt obligations" under Section 265(b)(3)(B)(i)(III) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and covenants and warrants that the District does not reasonably expect to issue warrants or bonds or other obligations

aggregating in the principal amount of more than \$10,000,000 during the calendar year in which the above Warrants are to be issued.

FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Sanitary and Improvement District No. 240 of Sarpy County, Nebraska, that this and the preceding Resolutions are hereby adopted as the Certificate With Respect to Arbitrage of the District pertaining to the above Warrants and the District and the Chairman and Clerk of the District hereby further certify, as of the date of the registration of the above Warrants with the County Treasurer of Sarpy County, Nebraska, as follows:

1. No separate reserve or replacement fund has been or will be established with respect to the above Warrants. The District reasonably anticipates that monies in its Bond Fund reasonably attributable to the above Warrants in excess of the lesser of: (a) ten percent (10%) of the net principal proceeds of the above Warrants, (b) the maximum annual debt service due on the above Warrants, or (c) one hundred twenty-five percent (125%) of average annual debt service due on the above Warrants will be expended for payment of principal of and interest on the above Warrants within thirteen (13) months after receipt of such monies. That amount which is currently held in the District's Bond Fund which exceeds the amount which is to be expended for payment of principal and interest on the above Warrants within thirteen (13) months after receipt of such monies, plus that amount arrived at pursuant to the immediately preceding sentence, will not be invested in any securities or any other investment obligations which bear a yield, as computed in accordance with the actuarial method, in excess of the yield on the above Warrants.
2. To the best of their knowledge, information and belief, the above expectations are reasonable.
3. The District has not been notified of any listing of it by the Internal Revenue Service as an issuer that may not certify its bonds.
4. This Certificate is being passed, executed and delivered pursuant to Section 1.148-2(b)(2) of the Income Tax Regulations under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

The Board discussed the billings of HTM Sales, Inc. The Board decided that it would continue to closely monitor the billings to make sure that all itemized charges were appropriate and for work performed. The Board agreed to coordinate such billings more closely with Lamp, Ryneerson & Associates, Inc., engineers for the District.

Discussion was had regarding "No Parking" signs within the District. The Board tabled further consideration until the spring.

The Board next discussed Lamp, Ryneerson's itemization, focusing on the itemization of its bill for erosion control, as well as services rendered for utility markings. At the conclusion of the discussion, the payment of the bill was reconfirmed.

The Board next presented certain preliminary bond debt service and cash flow analysis presented by Ameritas relative to the District's outstanding warrants. A thorough discussion was had regarding a reorganization of the District's debt and its impact upon the District. The Board discussed potential tax rates, cash payments to the current bondholders of the District, as well as the necessity for a bond issue to fund

such payments. At the conclusion of such discussion, counsel for the District, as well as Ameritas, were directed to proceed with such reorganization.

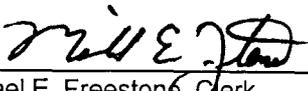
A discussion was next had regarding the possibility of the establishment of a park in the area of Pebblebrooke I, II and III. Certain areas where such a park may be established were discussed. It was indicated to the Board that Pebblebrooke IV would probably be undertaken in 2017, which may be an appropriate time for overall planning to discuss whether such a park may be established by the various Pebblebrooke phases.

The Board finally discussed the interlocal agreements the District had with various SIDs for maintenance of the sanitary sewer lift station and related improvements. Accountants for the District were to be directed to prepare billings for the interlocal agreements already in place. Counsel was directed to proceed to finalize the interlocal agreement with Sanitary and Improvement District No. 308 of Sarpy County, Nebraska (Pebblebrooke 2), as promptly as possible.
