WHEREAS, the 1989 Caterpillar 950E Front End Loader, S/N# 22Z4829 has been determined to be obsolete or not usable by the County:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Sarpy County Board of Commissioners that aforementioned front end loader is hereby declared to be surplus property and authorizes the Purchasing Department to dispose of the equipment in the best interest of Sarpy County; and

Re: Surplus Front End Loader

On February 23, 2010 the County Board tabled the Resolution to declare a 1989 Cat 950E front end loader surplus property. The Sarpy County Purchasing Department recommends declaring this machine surplus property due to the number of hours (over 30,000) and future use of the machine. With the large amount of hours, the '89 950E will likely require additional repairs. Fleet Services has determined that it may be more cost effective to replace the loader instead of rebuilding. This machine is a critical component for the landfill.

Sarpy County has the opportunity to purchase a 2007 front end loader that we are currently leasing. All current lease payments would be applied to the purchase. The sale of this piece of equipment would be approximately \$176,000 and carries a two (2) year, 3,000 hour power-train warranty. Current lease payments for this machine can be used towards the sale price. The landfill has currently made one (1) lease payment of \$2,350.00 for this machine, making the net cost \$173,650. A quote for a used 2009 Deere 644K with 810 hours was obtained from Murphy Tractor & Equipment Co. for \$183,817. A new front end loader that is equipped for the landfill would cost approximately \$220,000 - \$290,000 plus additional costs for the five (5) year warranty, depending upon the manufacturer and how the proposed machine is equipped.

Once the '89 950E is declared surplus, the Purchasing Department will work with the Landfill and Fleet Services to determine which steps are best for the County, either purchasing a used or new piece of equipment. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me at 593-4476.

Ref: Disposal of Wheel Loader for the Landfill

The Landfill has requested to replace the Cat 950E wheel loader. Unit L36 – 1989 Caterpillar Model 950E Serial Number 22Z04829 with approximately 33,443 hours. This unit will need in the near future to be rebuilt - remanufactured or replaced due to age and the number of hours on it. In recent months the loader has experienced a major transmission failure and was down being repaired for an extended period of time. It appears it might be more cost-effective with less down to replace the loader over the rebuilt/remanufacture process.

I would recommend that this unit be listed as a trade-in option in the bid for the newer replacement wheel loader and also be listed in the on-line equipment auction. With those results, the estimated cost to rebuild – remanufacture and estimated cost for replacement the decision to rebuild or replace will be clearer. Once we have all the information the final recommendation on the status of upgrading the wheel loader for the Landfill can be completed.

Re: Surplus Of Sarpy County Landfill Front End Loader

The Sarpy County Landfill is requesting to surplus a 1989 Caterpillar 950E Front End Loader. Per Sarpy County Resolution "Approving Vehicle Acquisition & Disbursement Policy", January 13, 1998, attached is Fleet Services' recommendation for disposal of the equipment.


The front end loader has high operation hours and repairs in the near future will not be cost effective. Rebuilding this machine would cost approximately \$143,000.

The Landfill is renting a 2007 CAT 950H Front End Loader, at \$2,350.00 per month, for nearly two months while their other front end loader was being repaired. The approximate purchase price of the 2007 CAT is \$176,000. The sale of the 1989 CAT is expected to bring approximately \$50,000. This amount would be applied toward the purchase of the 2007 CAT, making the sale price approximately \$126,000, also the rental fees will be applied toward the purchase price.

It is recommended that the attached Resolution, declaring 1989 Caterpillar 950E Front End Loader surplus property, be signed.
