## MEMO

**RE:** Resolution of Surplus L3 X-Ray Machines

Please find below the description of two old x-ray machines that Sarpy County Sheriff's Court Services is requesting permission to surplus.

1. L-3 Model Linescan 210-E, S/N# 55524. This x-ray machine was donated to the Sheriff's Department by the National Park Service in 2002. The Linescan 210 is completely inoperable, and since it is obsolete, repair is cost prohibitive. It would require qualified disposal due to the oil in the x-ray generation tube and the lead shielding. This machine was replaced by the L3 Model Linescan 215-E listed in Item #2 below.
2. L3 Model Linescan 215-E, S/N# 57911. This x-ray machine was donated to the Sheriff's Department by the U.S. Marshalls Service. This unit was showing an error message that the x-ray generation tube was failing. The repair quote at nearly \$10,000 in 2007 on another machine which was disposed of. The machine has been taken out of service and was replaced by the new Smiths Detection unit which was purchased last fall. A new x-ray machine has replace the old L3-215. The company who sold the County the new x-ray machine, quoted \$1,000.00 to dispose of the old machine.

Gary Mackeprang, Court Services, worked with Electronics Disposal Technologies, Inc. (EDT), last year, when the County had EDT dispose of three x-ray machines and some other equipment. EDT has a contract with the State of Nebraska for disposal of various types of environmentally sensitive equipment.

EDT will again accept the machines for a salvage fee of \$0.20 per pound. The x-ray machines weigh approximately 1,300 lbs. each. The disposal fee would total approximately \$520.00 for both machines. EDT would pick up the equipment and haul it to their facility to be weighed. EDT will send the County an invoice, which will state the weight, transfer of possession for disposal, and release of liability.

It is recommended that the attached Resolution, declaring the x-ray machines surplus property, be signed.
