WHEREAS, the Groen 20 Qt. Tilt Steam Kettle, Model TDB/7-40, SN# 10975, from Sarpy County Jail has been determined to be obsolete or not usable by the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Sarpy County Board of Commissioners that the tilt steam kettle from Sarpy County Jail is hereby declared to be surplus property and the Purchasing Department is hereby authorized to dispose of the tilt steam kettle in the best interest of Sarpy County.


