**RESOLUTION APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING CHAIRMAN TO  
SIGN AGREEMENT FOR TITLE 1, D FUNDING**

WHEREAS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-104(6)(Reissue 1997), the County has the power to do all acts in relation to the concerns of the County necessary to the exercise of its corporate powers; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-103 (Reissue 1997), the powers of the County as a body are exercised by the County Board; and,

WHEREAS, juveniles being held in the Sarpy County CARE Program's Holdover Facility are sometimes there for an extended period of time; and,

WHEREAS, Title 1, D funding is available to help to continue the education of these juveniles while in the CARE holdover; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of these juveniles to continue learning so they are able to transition back into their school district upon release from the holdover facility.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THIS BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS THAT the attached Agreement is hereby approved and the Chairman of this Board is authorized to sign said Agreement.

PAPILLION-LA VISTA PUBLIC SCHOOLS  
AND  
SARPY COUNTY CARE PROGRAM  
TITLE 1, PART D AGREEMENT  
2010-2011

The Papillion-La Vista Public Schools agrees to provide funds from Title 1, Part D to the Sarpy County Care program for the year 2010-2011 school year. Sarpy County Care Program under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 agrees to provide the following services to youth.

- 1). Where feasible, ensure educational programs in juvenile facilities are coordinated with the Student's home school, particularly with respect to special education students with an individualized education program;
- 2). Notify the local school of a youth if the youth is identified as in need of special education services while in the facility;
- 3). Where feasible, provide transition assistance to help the youth stay in school, including coordination of services for the family, counseling, assistance in accessing drug and alcohol abuse prevention programs, tutoring, and family counseling;
- 4). Provide support programs which encourages youth who have dropped out to reenter school once their term has been completed or provide such youth with the skills necessary for such youth to gain employment or seek a secondary school diploma or its recognized equivalent;
- 5). Work to ensure such facilities are staffed with teachers and other qualified staff who are trained to work with children with disabilities and other students with special needs taking into consideration the unique needs of such children and students;
- 6). Ensure educational programs in correctional facilities are related to assisting students meet high educational standards;
- 7). Use, to the extent possible, technology to assist in coordinating educational programs between the juvenile facility and the community school;
- 8). Where feasible, involve parents in efforts to improve the educational achievement of their children and prevent further involvement of such children in delinquent activities;
- 9). Coordinate funds received under this program with other local, State and Federal funds available to provide services to participating youth, such as funds under the Job Training Partnership Act, and vocational education funds;

- 10). Coordinate programs operated under this subpart with activities funded under the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention act of 1974 and other comparable programs, if applicable, and
- 11). If appropriate, work with local businesses to develop training and mentoring programs for participating youth.


In accordance with the services outlined in Section 1425 Sarpy County Care Program agrees to expend Title1, Part D money authorized by Papillion-La Vista Public Schools on the following items


- 1). Salaries
- 2). Benefits
- 3). Educational Supplies
- 4). Equipment

All equipment purchased with Title 1 money must receive an inventory number from Papillion-La Vista Public Schools. The equipment purchased with Title 1 money is the property of Papillion-La Vista Public Schools. If the funding for the Care program is discontinued by the School District or by the County the equipment purchased with the Title 1 money must be returned to the school district.


Accountability of the expenditures will be reported to Papillion-La Vista Public Schools on a quarterly basis. Papillion-La Vista Public Schools will reimburse the Sarpy County Sheriff's Office after expenditures occur and the District receives invoices. The Sarpy County Care Program must expend the funds for Title 1, Part D by August 31, 2011.
