Sarpy County Citizen Corps will contract with the Omaha Storm Chasers to implement a Disaster Preparedness night at Werner Park to kickoff Disaster Preparedness month. This project will increase personal awareness and community preparedness in the event of disaster.

The goal of Sarpy County Citizen Corps is to promote disaster preparedness in order to enhance public awareness. Sarpy County Citizen Corps will contract with the Omaha Storm Chasers to hold a community event at Sarpy County's new Werner Park. The event will be in conjunction with the last baseball game of the year and will kickoff Disaster Preparedness month. Werner Park holds 9,000 people. Everyone in attendance will benefit from the event. Additionally, the Omaha Storm Chasers games are broadcast on a local radio station potentially reaching listeners in the entire metro Omaha area.

The major activity of this proposal is to kickoff to Disaster Preparedness Month by holding a community even at Werner Park in Papillion, Nebraska on September 1, 2011. This event will include: In-Stadium promo over the stadium PA and a video display board, PA and video announcements, fun facts about getting prepared, a 30-second commercial, booths, banners, brochures and equipment at the stadium. A similar successful event was held at Rosenblatt.

Sarpy County Citizen Corps will demonstrate increased participation in The Five Programs, increased activity on the web site, increased attendance at the monthly meetings and increased awareness in the community to prepare for disasters.

RE: Sarpy County Citizen Corps Disaster Preparedness/Awareness Night with Omaha Storm Chasers


On March 22, 2011, the County Board will be asked to authorize the Chairman to sign the grant application for the Citizen Corps grant for a Disaster Preparedness/Awareness Night at Werner Park. The Disaster Preparedness night will be held on Thursday, September 1, 2011 to kick off Disaster Preparedness month.

Sarpy County Citizen Corps will request \$7,000 from Nebraska Emergency Management Agency (NEMA). \$5,500 will fund a contract with the Omaha Storm Chasers which will include; in- stadium promo and video display board, PA and video announcements during the game, fun facts about getting prepared for a disaster after each inning, a 30 second video commercial, opportunity to hang banners, set up booths, tables, equipment and vehicles outside the entrance to the stadium, first pitch opportunity prior to the game, and an opportunity for a member of Sarpy County Citizen Corps to be interviewed before and during the game. Additionally, \$1,500 will be used to purchase promotional items for display and brochures or booklets to hand out.

There will be no County match required if the grant request is approved.
