WHEREAS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-103 (Reissue 2007), the powers of the County as a body are exercised by the County Board; and,


WHEREAS, a grant is available to the Sarpy County Sheriff's Department through PRIDE-Omaha; and,

WHEREAS, the grant awards reimbursement to Sarpy County for conducting TRACE investigations; and,


WHEREAS, Sarpy County is committed to and supports the Grant with PRIDE-Omaha to conduct TRACE investigations; and,

Target Responsibility For Alcohol Connected Emergencies


The Sarpy County Sheriff Department and Pride-Omaha, Inc. agree to the following responsibilities relating to the implementation of the LiveWise TRACE (Target Responsibility for Alcohol Connected Emergencies) grant.

1. The term of this Agreement shall be for the period beginning July 1, 2011 and ending April 30, 2012.
2. These operations will be conducted in Sarpy County, Nebraska.
3. For purposes of completing the TRACE operations, the Sarpy County Sheriff Department will be responsible for conducting discretionary investigations to determine who provided the alcohol for minor(s), on an as-needed basis, following crimes or incidences involving underage individuals who have been consuming alcohol, during the period beginning July 1, 2011 and ending April 30, 2012.
4. PRIDE-Omaha, Inc. will reimburse up to \$1,000 to the Sarpy County Sheriff Department for the operational costs of conducting TRACE investigation(s) during the period beginning July 1, 2011 and ending April 30, 2012. Reimbursement will be made for overtime expenses.
5. Officers will complete the supplied, required reporting forms on each TRACE operation in its entirety, providing general information on the names of adults arrested and any retailers in violation. Court dates and times will also be noted. PRIDE-Omaha, Inc. will provide TRACE summary and reimbursement request forms. One summary and one reimbursement form is to be completed by the Sarpy County Sheriff Department for each day of operations conducted. The two completed forms are to be sent to PRIDE-Omaha, Inc. within 10 days of that operation.

Target Responsibility for Alcohol Connected Emergencies

Law enforcement investigations to find who provided alcohol for minors

TRACE is a law enforcement protocol wherein first responders to underage alcohol-related emergencies can be reimbursed by PRIDE-Omaha, Inc. for officer overtime in order to immediately begin investigating who provided the minor(s) with the alcohol.


In conjunction with the LiveWise Coalition, PRIDE-Omaha, Inc. authorizes law enforcement agencies that work with PRIDE on MIP Party Patrols to spend up to \$1,000 during the coming year, July 1, 2011 through April 30, 2012 on TRACE investigations. These funds can be used for officer overtime to immediately begin investigating who provided the alcohol to minors following any underage alcohol-related problems or incidents.

These problems can include car crashes, assaults, sexual attacks, crimes, or juvenile drinking parties, among others. Immediate investigations are important, since that is often the best time to determine the truth as to the facts of the crime.

Within ten days following the investigation, law enforcement agencies will complete two simple TRACE reporting forms (the *Investigation Reporting Form* and the *Reimbursement Reporting Form*), and return the completed forms to PRIDE-Omaha, Inc., 6143 Whitmore Street, Omaha, NE 68152 or Fx: 402-397-9924.

PRIDE-Omaha Inc. will then reimburse the agency within ten days following receipt of the completed forms.

On September 13, 2011, the County Board will be asked to ratify the submission and award for the TRACE Patrols Grant Award with PRIDE-Omaha. The grant was applied for and submitted by the SCSO.
