RESOLUTION SETTING SARPY COUNTY TAX REQUEST FOR 2012 FISCAL YEAR

WHEREAS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-104(6) (Reissue 2007), the County has the power to do all acts in relation to the concerns of the County necessary to the exercise of its corporate powers; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-103 (Reissue 2007), the powers of the County as a body are exercised by the County Board; and,

WHEREAS, §77-1601.02 (Reissue 2003) provides that the property tax request for the prior year shall be the property tax request for the current year unless the County Board passes by a majority vote a Resolution setting the tax request at a different amount; and,

WHEREAS, the property tax requirements for the 2012 fiscal year have been determined to be \$33,582,461 and,

WHEREAS, all public notice requirements have been met.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of Commissioners of Sarpy County, Nebraska that the Sarpy County property tax request for the 2012 fiscal year is hereby set at \$33,582,461.

The above Resolution was approved by a vote of the Sarpy County Board of Commissioners at a public meeting duly held in accordance with applicable law on the 13th day of September, 2011.


