POWER SUPPLY (UPS) SURPLUS PROPERTY


WHEREAS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-104(6) (Reissue 2007), the County has the power to do all acts in relation to the concerns of the County necessary to the exercise of its corporate powers; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-103 (Reissue 2007), the powers of the County as a body are exercised by the County Board; and,

WHEREAS, the two Toshiba Uninterruptible Power Supply (UPS) units, SN#95402800 & SN#95402801, have been determined to be obsolete or not usable by the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SARPY COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS THAT the uninterruptible power supply units listed above are hereby declared to be surplus property and the Purchasing Department is authorized to dispose of the UPS units in the best interest of Sarpy County.



**Re:** Resolution Declaring Two Toshiba Uninterruptible Power Supply Units Surplus Property

I have placed on the March 27, 2012 agenda, a Resolution declaring two Toshiba Uninterruptible Power Supply (UPS) Units, SN#95402800 & SN#95402801, as surplus property.

They were removed from service because they were no longer supported by the manufacturer and were at end of life. The units were replaced with new ones.

Jim Tracy, Information Systems Department, contacted other counties to find out if there is a need for the equipment, none were interested. Most recycle companies would charge for the disposal of the units. A local contractor will take the UPSs in exchange for the salvage value at no cost to the County. The Purchasing Department will dispose of the UPS as required by law in the best interests of Sarpy County.
