RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE E911 SURCHARGE FOR 2014 FY
SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA

WHEREAS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-104(6)(Reissue 2007), the County has the power to do all acts in relation to the concerns of the County necessary to the exercise of its corporate powers; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-103 (Reissue 2007), the powers of the County as a body are exercised by the County Board; and

WHEREAS, Neb. Rev. Stat. Sec. 86-1006 (Reissue 2008) requires the County Board to set the rate of service surcharge for E911 to be collected for the coming year by no later than September 1; and

WHEREAS, the County is obligated to continue the current rate in order to adequately fund the existing operations of the E911 Center.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Sarpy County Board of Commissioners that the E911 Service Surcharge as allowed under Neb. Rev. Stat. Sec. 86-1001 to 1009 (Reissue 2008) commencing January 1, 2014, will continue to be in the amount of \$1.00 per month on each local exchange access line physically terminating within the jurisdiction of Sarpy County.





Re: Certification of E911 Surcharge

We are required by the law to recertify our E911 surcharge by September 1 of each year. The attached resolution will retain the rate at \$1.00 per month per line, which is the maximum allowed by law. This fee will bring in around \$505,000 out of total budget requirements of approximately \$3,740,084. After subtracting cash on hand and other revenues, the remaining \$3,053,824 will come from contributions from the County and the cities.
