WHEREAS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-104(6)(Reissue 2012), the County has the power to do all acts in relation to the concerns of the County necessary to the exercise of its corporate powers; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. §23-103 (Reissue 2012), the powers of the County as a body are exercised by the County Board; and,

WHEREAS, juveniles being held in the Sarpy County CARE Program's Holdover Facility are sometimes there for an extended period of time; and,

WHEREAS, Title 1, D funding is available to help to continue the education of these juveniles while in the CARE holdover; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of these juveniles to continue learning so they are able to transition back into their school district upon release from the holdover facility.



Re: Title I, Part D Funding Agreement

For several years, Sarpy County has been eligible to receive Federal Title I, Part D funding through the Papillion-LaVista Public Schools (PLVPS) for juveniles held in the Holdover Facility. The expected dollar amount for the 2014-2015 grant will be approximately \$56,000 along with any carryover of unspent funds from 2013-2014. PLVPS will send a final amount once the grant application has been approved.

The attached Resolution and Agreement provide for the transfer of the Title I, Part D funds from (PLVPS). This has been placed on the July 8, 2014 Board agenda for recommended approval. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me at (402) 593-4476.

TITLE 1, PART D AGREEMENT  
2014-15

The Papillion-La Vista School District agrees to provide funds from Title 1, Part D to the Sarpy County Juvenile Justice Center for the year 2014-15 school year. Sarpy County Juvenile Justice Center under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 agrees to provide the following services to youth.

- 1). Where feasible, ensure that educational programs in juvenile facilities are coordinated with the student's home school, particularly with respect to a student with an individualized educational program under Part B of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.
- 2). Notify the local school of a youth if the youth is identified as in need of special education services while in the facility;
- 3). Where feasible, provide transition assistance to help the youth stay in school, including coordination of services for the family, counseling, assistance in accessing drug and alcohol abuse prevention programs, tutoring, and family counseling;
- 4). Provide support programs that encourage youth who have dropped out to reenter school once their term at the juvenile facility has been completed, or provide such youth with the skills necessary gain employment or seek a secondary school diploma or its recognized equivalent;
- 5). Work to ensure that the juvenile facilities are staffed with teachers and other qualified staff who are trained to work with children with disabilities and other students with special needs taking into consideration the unique needs of such children and youth;
- 6). Ensure that educational programs in juvenile facilities are related to assisting students to meet high academic achievement standards;
- 7). To the extent possible, use technology to assist in coordinating educational programs between the juvenile facility and the community school;
- 8). Where feasible, involve parents in efforts to improve the educational achievement of their children and prevent further involvement of such children in delinquent activities;

- 9). Coordinate funds received under this subpart with other local, State and Federal funds available to provide services to participating youth, such as funds made available under Title I of Public Law 105-220, and vocational and technical education funds;
- 10). Coordinate programs operated under this subpart with activities funded under the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention act of 1974 and other comparable programs, if applicable, and
- 11). If appropriate, work with local businesses to develop training, curriculum based youth entrepreneurship education, and mentoring programs for participating youth.

In accordance with the services outlined in Section 1425, The Sarpy County Juvenile Justice Center agrees to expend Title1, Part D money authorized by the Papillion-La Vista School District on the following items

- 1). Salaries
- 2). Benefits
- 3). Educational Supplies
- 4). Equipment

All equipment purchased with Title 1 money must receive an inventory number from the Papillion-La Vista School District. The equipment purchased with Title 1 money is the property of the Papillion-La Vista School District. If the funding for the program is discontinued by the School District or by the County the equipment purchased with the Title 1 money must be returned to the School District.

Accountability of the expenditures will be reported to the Papillion-La Vista School District on a quarterly basis. The Papillion-La Vista School District will reimburse the Sarpy County Sheriff's Office after expenditures occur and the District receives invoices. The Sarpy County Juvenile Justice Center must expend the funds for Title 1, Part D by August 31, 2015.
